Firelands' Finances - March Update

Last month, Governor Kasich released his proposed budget for the next two years and in that proposal Firelands stands to lose \$363,522 in both 2018 and 2019, totaling over \$700,000. If this budget passes, our schools will be dealt a devastating blow and we will have to make significant changes to the way education is delivered. State funding makes up a full 38% of our revenue. Slightly over half is from property taxes and 11% comes from other sources.

As it stands, Firelands has the lowest school taxes of


all fourteen districts in Lorain County- the only source of funding that we can control. It has been 7 years since we have asked voters to support an operating increase and we have maintained educational quality by finding efficiencies and keeping costs low. Our per pupil expenditure is \$1,500 lower than the state average and \$300 lower than the next lowest school district in Lorain County.

The House of Representatives is currently working on their own budget proposal. In order to stop these drastic cuts in State support, please contact our elected leaders and ask them to maintain our current level of funding.

On Tuesday April 11th registration will be from 12:00 p.m.- 8:00 p.m. at the Board Office.

Registrations after April 11th will be by appointment and only on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

SCHOOL IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS FOR 2017-18

It is not too soon to be thinking ahead to next school year. If your child will be entering school for the first time, or after attending school elsewhere, please be sure to check that he/she is in compliance with State of Ohio immunization requirements before the school year begins.

Kindergarten – once your child has reached age 4, s/he can complete all required immunizations for diphtheria, pertussis, tetanus (DPT), polio (IPV), hepatitis B (HBV), measles mumps, rubella (MMR), and varicella (chickenpox). If possible, have them done and bring a copy of the record to Kindergarten registration April 10-13, 2017.

Grades 1-6 – same requirements as for Kindergarten

Grades 7-8 – Grades K-6 requirements plus Tdap (DPT booster) and MCV (meningococcal vaccine)

Grades 9-11 – Grades K-6 requirements plus Tdap (received in 7th grade or later)

Grade 12 – Grades 9-11 requirements plus MCV (must be received at age 16 or older)


Remember to bring your child's immunization records with you when you go to your healthcare provider or clinic. Please send a copy of the immunization record to the school nurse in your child's building, being sure your child's name is on it. Don't forget to keep a copy for yourself!

The Lorain County General Health District (LCGHD) is now offering immunizations by appointment. Call 440-284-3206 to make an immunization appointment for children and adults. Bring all immunization records, insurance cards, and cash or check; although some children may be eligible for discounts under the Vaccines for Children (VFC) program. All children under age 18 must be accompanied by a parent or guardian.

Note: Ask your provider about additional vaccines that are recommended for children ages 11-19 such as 2^{nd} dose of varicella (chickenpox), hepatitis A and human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccines.



Elementary Math Students Earn First Place at Sphero Coding Competition

You've heard of robotics. You've heard of coding. But have you heard of SPHERO? If the word Sphero is new to you, just talk to a student from Mrs. Dempsey's 4th or 5th grade math classes at Firelands Elementary. These young mathematicians are on the verge of becoming Sphero experts.



Sphero robots were introduced to students in January by the gifted education department at the Educational Service Center (ESC). The ESC recently hosted a competition at LCCC called STEAM-24, formerly known as Math Mania. The competition got its name because the Sphero robots inspire learning that integrates computer science (S), technology (T), engineering (E), art (A), and math (M).

To prepare for the competition, teams of students learned to code Sphero using block style coding in an app called Lightning Lab. Using an iPad, students worked collaboratively, making decisions about speed, distance, and angles. The challenge was to code Sphero to maneuver through a complicated obstacle course within one minute, gathering as many points as



possible. Patience was exercised as students persevered through much trial and error.

At the STEAM-24 competition, each team had one chance to tap the start button within their program, and hope that Sphero followed the code as it had in their many test runs. Tension was high among teams from all 8 participating school districts on the day of the competition. The hard work paid off, though, as the 4th grade team from Firelands Elementary was called to the front of the crowded room to accept the district level *I*st *Place Trophy*.

Congratulations to all the Sphero teams on working together to accomplish a challenging goal!

CURRICULUM UPDATE

Third grade students at Firelands Elementary are embarking on a myON adventure, thanks to a grant awarded from the Ohio Literacy Innovation. MyON offers unlimited access to thousands of digital books. Through the integration of this program, several 3rd grade students are completing Landform projects. With the collection of high-interest books, the students are not only comparing and contrasting different landforms such as; deltas, mountains, valleys, and islands, but they are also writing online essays incorporate-



ing the information learned from the vast collection of high-interest, leveled books. The students have expressed an overwhelming desire to read books and complete future projects. Through the utilization of myON, teachers have the ability to easily monitor the students' online presence and easily adapt assignments on an as needed basis. Projects can be modified to meet the needs of all online users. Be sure to ask your child about their myON experience.


Express Art Camp Returns to FES


