JUNIOR SAT DAY – WENDESDAY, MARCH 4TH – The Ohio Department of Education provides the SAT to all juniors, free of charge. The SAT testing date will be on Wednesday, March 4th, with testing beginning at 7:30 am on that date. This is a mandatory test for all juniors, including students attending the LCJVS and CCP full-day students at both Lorain County Community College and BG-Firelands. Student in the other three grades will not have class that day at Firelands High School. Students in grades 9, 10, and 12 should use the day to shadow career interests, or make it a college visit day. The SAT should end that day about noon. They will be excused at that time. Lunch will be provided, but is not required. Students who receive testing accommodations may test that date until approximately 1:30 pm. Please check with your student to see if they will receive special testing accommodations. Students will begin to pre-register for the SAT in class, and counselors will travel to the JVS to pre-register our students who attend school there. Again, this is a mandatory test for all juniors, regardless of what school they attend (LCCC, FHS, LCJVS). Please contact our school counseling office if you need further details.

STAYING CYBER SAFE – Dave Miller, from NORT2H, came out on Wednesday and gave our staff a 45 minute presentation on Cyber safety. Dave allowed us to share with the parents and students, so here is the Tiny URL to be able to view the presentation. FIRELANDS SOCIAL WORKER SERVICES – Deanna Watts, the Firelands Schools Social worker, is a trained mental health professional who can assist with mental health concerns, behavioral concerns, positive behavioral support, academic, and classroom support, consultation with teachers, parents, and administrators as well as provide individual and group counseling/therapy. She is another resource for our students and families to access in for the above supports.

In other words, Deanna provides individual, confidential help and support to students who deal with anxiety, depression, relationship struggles, school stress, and other mental health issues. Deanna provides a confidential, safe place to discuss concerns as well as explore solutions to cope with stressors. She is an excellent link to outside resources in the community, linking them to families in the district. She can also help facilitate communication between schools and families. OHSAA AND INTERSCHOLASTIC ELIGIBILITY – As we move into the third grading period, we like to remind both students and parents about the OHSAA and Firelands Schools eligibility requirements for extra-curricular activities. Students are required to pass the equivalent of 5 one-credit courses in the previous grading period to be eligible for the current grading period. Students must also earn a grading period GPA of 1.5 or above to remain eligible. For CCP students, each class they take counts for two HS credits per grading period. Therefore, a CCP student who passes three CCP classes would be passing the equivalent of six classes. Anything less than the equivalent of five 1-credit classes passed would render the student ineligible for the current grading period. VOTER REGISTRATION DRIVE – Students who will be 18-years old by the General Election, on Tuesday, November 3rd are eligible to register to vote. Through Mr. Kirsch, Mrs. Notarberardino, Mrs. Costello, and Ms. Kolarik, students will be able to obtain and submit voter registration forms through these teachers. You must be submit your registration to these teachers by February 12th to be eligible to vote in the March Primary election on Tuesday, March 17th. 17-year olds who will be 18 by the General Election are eligible to vote in the March Primary, but not for any issues, just primary candidates. Your forms will be delivered to the appropriate county Board of Election by February 13th (Erie, Huron or Lorain County). Exercise your right as an American Citizen to vote, get registered and be heard.

FALCON SHOWCASE - Come join us on Tuesday, March 10th for the Falcon Showcase, which is studentfocused and is a direct reflection of their hard work and dedication. This is an excellent opportunity for the community to see the quality instruction within our buildings, and what the students have produced.
