LEARNING TARGETS -HOW DO I USE THEM

FHS students are well aware of the learning targets that their teachers post each day, so they understand what they should have taken away from daily lessons in each classroom. The next question from students is, how do I use them after the day in question.

Students should keep a log of their daily learning targets to help keep them up-to-date on what will be asked of them on summative

assessments at the end of a unit or chapter. Students should keep track of their progress and speak to their teachers about targets that are confusing or unclear. One of the best ways for students to take charge of their learning is to track their progress and self-assess on whether they understand what is being covered in each class.

FAST and Teacher Tutoring

periods are excellent ways for students to get extra help and tips on topics where they may need extra remediation. Students are encouraged to track their progress in each class, which is why teachers always update their grades at least weekly, with many teachers doing this on a daily basis.

GREAT EFFORT AT BUCKEYE - Falcon Nation was strong on Friday night at Buckeye, cheering the Falcons on in front of a standing room only crowd at Buckeye. The Falcons came up just short, 25-22, dropping their first game of the year to the undefeated Bucks. The Falcons sit in 7th place in Division IV, Region 14. The top eight schools qualify for the OHSAA Football playoffs, which begin on Friday evening, November 3rd at the site of the higher ranked team.

PSAT PARTICIPATION - Almost 100 Sophomores and Juniors participated in the PSAT last Wednesday, which is an excellent practice test for both the SAT and ACT. Students should be receiving the results in early December, and can utilize the resources provided by the College Board, which aligns their PSAT performance with areas of strength and weakness when preparing for either college entrance test.
