#### Kindergarten 2020-2021 Registration Begins March 3

On March 3, Firelands' district parents and open enrollment applicants can begin registering their kindergartners for Fall 2020 online or in person at the Board of Education, 112 N. Lake St. in South Amherst. Online registration information will be posted on the website soon. In person registration is scheduled for March 3 from 8:00 to 3:00, or March 4, 3:30 to 7:00. No appointment is necessary.

Parents should be prepared to bring or upload the following documents: child's birth certificate, parent's identification card, two proofs of residency, shot records and if applicable, custody papers.

Applications for open enrollment are currently being accepted and must be completed before registering a student for kindergarten. For open enrollment questions, call the Board of Education at (440) 965-5821. For questions regarding registration, call Firelands Elementary School at (440) 965-5381.

#### **Construction Update**

In December, January and February meetings were held for students, staff and community to receive their input regarding the construction plans for the new high school. These educational visioning meetings form the basis of the criteria used to define the characteristics of the new building. These meetings assure that the community and District's goals are in alignment. This long and detailed process is critical in developing the blueprints for our new high school and we appreciate everyone's time and input.

New building tours continue as we look at the best ways to capture each dollar. These visits allow the team to see hands on the results of similar projects and learn from the experience of other districts. Moving forward, 2020 will primarily be a design year, with hopes of having a building pad started by late fall. All of 2021 through spring of 2022 will be construction. 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




Above, students at SAMS worked in small groups to share their ideas of what they want to see in a new high school. All ideas were recorded and discussed with our architect.

#### JUNIOR SAT DAY – WEDNESDAY, MARCH 4TH

The Ohio Department of Education provides the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) to all juniors, free of charge. The SAT testing date will be on Wednesday, March 4th, with testing beginning at 7:30 a.m. on that date. This is a mandatory test for all juniors, including students attending the LCJVS



and CCP full-day students at both Lorain County Community College and BG-Firelands.

Student in the other three grades will not have class that day at Firelands High School. Students in grades 9, 10, and 12 should use the day to shadow career interests, or make it a college visit day. The SAT should end that day about noon. They will be excused at that time. Lunch will be provided, but is not required.

Students who receive testing accommodations may test that date until approximately 1:30 p.m. Please check with your student to see if they will receive special testing accommodations.

Students will begin to preregister for the SAT in class and counselors will travel to the JVS to pre-register our students who attend school there.

Again, this is a mandatory test for all juniors, regardless of what school they attend (LCCC, FHS, or LCJVS). Please contact our school counseling office if you need further details or have any questions about this process.

#### SAT PRE-REGISTRATION

All juniors will be pre-registered for the March 4<sup>th</sup> test during class periods at FHS. Mr. Maver will be at the LCJVS registering all students who attend the LCJVS later this month.

#### **Stained Glass Event Returns**

The stained glass window mosaic gallery reception and silent auction returns for the 10th year. Join the Art 3, 4 and AP students for a celebration and demonstration of their 10 weeks of focused crafting in stained glass. 14 Students used salvaged windows and donated stained glass scraps to build their designs in mosaic. Many will be available for you to bid on. A reception will be held in the FHS library from 6:30-7:30 on March 24. Refreshments will be served and students will demonstrate the process. The



silent auction opens at 6:45 and closes at 7:15. Winning bidders must pay via check that evening. All windows are on display in the FHS library now through the close of the auction on March 24.

The FHS art department is funded entirely on student fees and the generous support of the community. This project started in 2010. The first auction and reception was held in 2011. Over 145 windows later, the students and art department have earned nearly \$5000.

The sales fund the students directly, restocks tools and supplies for next year's project and the art class field trip to Cleveland public art, museums and galleries in September.

Local artists Sheree Ferrato of Verite Glass in Oberlin and Mark Mazurak generously donated 25 gallons of scrap stained glass this year.

Open to the public and community all supporters of Firelands, family, friends and neighbors of student artists, rising art students and collectors of art are encouraged to attend this event.

#### 2020 Summer Art Camp

The 2020 Summer Art Camp is now enrolling for Firelands students who have just completed grades K - 8. Students can spend 5 mornings creating art. This year's theme is "Game Time". Each day will introduce a new topic to inspire the hands-on art projects and activities. Students will draw, paint, print, craft and sculpt during the week. Founded by 2017 alumnus Grace Pohorence for her 2016 Girl Scout Gold Award project, this program is operated by the Firelands High School Art Society. Campers will be divided into four "studios" of completed-grades K-1, 2-3, 4-5 and 6-8 with two high school art students teaching each studio. A maximum of 15 campers will be accepted to each class. A waitlist will be kept. High School Art Teacher Laura Tawil will be on-site supervising the entire camp.

Camp is held at Firelands Elementary School June 15-19 from 9am until 11am. Registration forms are available from FES (Mrs. Proehl) and SAMS (Mrs. Szemplak) or by emailing Laura Tawil at <ltd>ltawil@firelandsschools.org>. Camp costs \$25 per child. Cash is accepted, and checks can be made out to "Firelands Fine Arts". Enrollment closes May 15.

## **Open Enrollment Process**

On February 3rd, Firelands Local School District began accepting open enrollment applications for new K-12 students for the 2020-2021 school year. Parents from any school district in Ohio are welcome to apply, but space is limited and will be awarded on a first come, first served basis. Enrollment is tuition free, but parents must pay for all school fees.

If a grade level closes, we will still encourage parents to complete the open enrollment application and will maintain waiting lists until July 1st. On July 1st, open enrollment will end for the 2020-2021 school year.

The new online application is working well and does provide space for you to upload documents in PDF format, such as IEP, WEP or 504 plans. If you are unable to do the uploads, you can bring the documents to

the board office. Parents of new high school students also need to submit their last report card.

Parents will be notified of their status by Superintendent's Office throughout the process. Please contact Sue Schaefer in the Superintendent's Office at 440-965-5821 if you have questions.

RETURNING Open Enrollment Parents: If your child was open-enrolled last year, you must confirm that they are continuing by filling out the quick online form.

It will be found in the same location, on the "student registration" page of the website. You will receive confirmation of their continued openenrollment by email from the Superintendent's Office.

Actual registration for new students will begin in April, so look for more information about that in the next Express!



#### **Transportation Updates**

In October 2018, just one week after National School Bus Safety Week, there were three separate accidents that took the lives of five students in three different states. In Indiana, 3 members of the same family were killed as the-driver claims she did not see the bus until it was too late, though the bus was stopped with is warning lights on and the students had already begun to cross the road.

This has been an ongoing issue, but it is happening far too often, many times making national news even when there is no one struck or injured. In the Cleveland area, a driver drove on the sidewalk to go around the bus and last fall one driver drove into a yard to get around a bus. As a bus driver, it is nearly impossible to write down a license number, description of the driver, make and model of the vehicle, all while you are



paying attention to the safety of the students!

Last fall, Firelands approved the installation of three stop arm cameras as a pilot program to gather information needed by our Law enforcement agency to track the violators. We selected buses that travel on Baumhart Road and some of State Route 113. as they seem to be the areas that have the most violators. Since mid-November, we have had found that between the Ohio

turnpike and North Ridge Road to be the area that has seen the most occurrences!

The intent is not see to how many people we can turn in for passing the buses that are stopped for loading or unloading, but for the safety of our students as we share the roadways with all the traffic.

Remember, the yellow warning lights mean the bus is slowing down and approaching a school bus stop. When the driver stops and opens the door, the red lights automatically come on, and you are required to stop according to ORC 4511.75.

Here is what Ohio law says about stopping for a school bus:

Drivers on the road may be confused when they see a school bus stop arm pop out during a student's drop-off. When do drivers need to stop and when are they allowed

to continue driving? The law depends on the number of lanes.

On a two-lane roadway, even a roadway with a center turn lane, drivers traveling in both directions must stop for school buses. By law, drivers must remain stopped until the bus is in motion again or the bus driver signals that traffic can proceed.

On a road with four or more lanes, drivers on the opposite site of a stopped school bus do not need to stop. Only vehicles on the same side of the roadway are required to stop. That law is applicable in Ohio, but not in all other states. On roads with four or more lanes, Ohio law requires that school buses pick up students on the same side of the road that the passenger lives on.

A driver breaking these laws can face fines up to \$500 and a temporarily suspended license.

#### **School Immunization Requirements for 2019-2020**

If your child will be entering 12<sup>th</sup> grade, 7<sup>th</sup> grade or any grade for the first time -- it is now time to update immunizations. If entering school for the first time, or after attending school elsewhere, please be sure to check that your child is in compliance with State of Ohio immunization requirements.

- Kindergarten once your child has reached age 4, s/he can complete all required immunizations for diphtheria, pertussis, tetanus (DPT), polio (IPV), hepatitis B (HBV), measles mumps, rubella (MMR), and varicella (chickenpox). If going to be entering kindergarten next year, if possible, have them done and bring a copy of the record to Kindergarten screening in May.
- **Grades 1-6** same requirements as for Kindergarten
- Grades 7-10 grades K-6 requirements plus Tdap (DPT booster) and MCV (meningococcal vaccine)
- Grade 11 grades K-6 requirements plus Tdap (received in 7th grade or later)
- Grade 12 grade 11 requirements plus MCV (must be received at age 16 or older)

Remember to bring your child's immunization records with you when you go to your healthcare provider or clinic. Please send a copy of the immunization record to the school nurse in your child's building, being sure your child's name is on it. Don't forget to keep a copy for yourself!

**Lorain County Public Health**, 9880 S. Murray Ridge Rd., Elyria, OH 44035 is now offering immunizations (also known as vaccines) Monday through Friday, 8:30 am – 3:30 pm, with evening hours throughout the month. A full vaccine clinic schedule is available at **www.LorainCountyHealth.com**.

Appointments are encouraged, although walk-ins are accepted. Call **440-284-3206** for information or to make an appointment for both children and adults. Bring all immunization records, insurance cards, and cash or check; although some children may be eligible for discounts under the Vaccines for Children (VFC) program. All children under age 18 must be accompanied by a parent or guardian.

**Note:** Ask your provider about additional vaccines that are recommended for children ages 11-19 such as 2<sup>nd</sup> dose of varicella (chickenpox), hepatitis A and human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccines. submitted by Linda Matus, School Nurse

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
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
