As we end the 2012-2013 school year, I feel compelled to highlight the many services that our schools and students engage in to help the community and to serve others. Throughout the year, various school organizations sponsor service-learning projects to support identified needs across the region and our nation. This year’s activities include:

Firelands High School

Our Teen Leadership Corp, led by FHS counselor Diane Zimmer, engaged in the following service projects:

- ◆ Hat, Gloves and Mitten Drive for the Boys and Girls Club
- ◆ Kick It for Cancer Kickball Tournament & Food Drive
- ◆ Mentoring “the Little’s Program” at FES and with the MH Unit
- ◆ Holiday Week—kindergarten activity, door décor, toy drive, tacky sweater fund raiser
- ◆ Harvest for Hunger and worked at the food bank to prepare boxes for 300 needy families
- ◆ Pennies for Patients for Leukemia and Lymphoma Society raising \$1994.20
- ◆ Goodwill Drive, No Bull Challenge, Freshmen Fair, Muth Benefit Dance totaling \$1300.00
- ◆ Buckle Up Campaign, which we won for the first time in Lorain County.
- ◆ Special Olympics

Our FFA chapter, led by Shanna Finnegan, engaged in the following service projects :

- ◆ Students in the FFA participated in the Invest to Fight Hunger National FFA Grant program. Only 30 schools in the USA piloted the program. Firelands FFA gave presentations to leaders at FHS, FFA officers from neighboring schools, the Ashland FFA Leadership Night, and to FHS teachers. Students donated 28 hours to the Second Harvest Food Bank.

FFA members organized the Harvest for America Food Drive and collected canned goods at the high school. Over 2000 pounds of food were donated to the First United Methodist Church in South Amherst. This is the only food pantry that directly serves our school district.

◆ Firelands FFA members collected over \$1000 in pocket change to buy gifts for four Firelands families for our annual Christmas Family Community Service.

◆ FFA members donated over 1400 hours of community service in individual community service activities. Chrissy Balint logged the most hours at nearly 200 hours!

◆ FFA members, with members from Wellington and the LCJVS, planned and conducted the annual County Wide Food for America agricultural literacy event for inner city fourth graders at the Lorain County Fairgrounds.

South Amherst Middle School

◆ SAMS students provided 500 books during the book fair week that were donated to FES teachers for creating classroom libraries. Sponsorship of the project was through the PTG at SAMS and FES

◆ Donated clothing to the needy

◆ Thanksgiving meals for the needy (6th Grade Service Project)

SAMS Projects:

◆ The **eighth grade students** stopped at Shanksville, PA and dropped off funds that they have collected for victims and for memorial up-keep from the tragedy of September 11, 2001. The class also collaborated with the Village of South Amherst to work on beautifying the cemetery grounds. In addition, students filled milk jugs with toiletry and various other personal hygiene items that were given to a local homeless shelter.

◆ The **sixth grade students** added service time into their daily schedule while attending the sixth grade outdoor adventure. The students performed various tasks to help clean-up and prepare the campgrounds for the 2013 season. The students cleaned debris from the beach, cleared brush from walking paths, cleaned up trash that blew into the woods during the winter, cleaned up the wetland trails, and many other tasks asked of them by the camp administration. The Beulah Beach staff is appreciative of our

students and their efforts they look forward to our continued service.

Firelands Elementary

◆ In partnership with the Nord Center, our first grade teachers and students planted trees for Earth Day.

◆ Once again, hundreds of Firelands Elementary students brought in toys for the Chronicle’s Not Forgotten Box collection. This is a long-standing tradition in our community every December as a way to help area families. The Salvation Army then distributed toys.

◆ A large group of FES families and staff members also purchased toys and clothing to help some of our own Firelands families.

Through their efforts, our students, staff, and community have truly made a difference in the lives of many people. Thank you for your willingness to reach out and lend a hand to those in need. This is an important lesson that I hope our students will carry with them for their entire lives.

LCJVS Outstanding Senior Students

Firelands FFA Members Make School History at State FFA Convention Columbus, OH - On May 2nd and 3rd, four Firelands FFA members that were previously selected at state evaluation as the top four Proficiency Award finalists in the state, interviewed to determine final placings. The Agricultural Proficiency Awards honor FFA members who, through their Supervised Agricultural Experience Project (SAE), have developed specialized skills that they can apply toward their future careers. An SAE program is the actual, hands-on application of concepts and principles learned in the agricultural education classroom. Students are supervised by agricultural education teachers in cooperation with parents, employers and other adults who assist them in the development and achievement of their educational and career goals.

Students can compete for awards in 47 areas covering everything from Agricultural Communications to Wildlife Management. Each award area has two categories, placement and entrepreneurship. Placement proficiency awards are given to those whose SAEs are related to employment, apprenticeships, or internships at an agribusiness or agriculture-related organization.

Entrepreneurship proficiency awards are given to those whose SAEs are related to ownership of an agribusiness or agriculture-related organization.

Proficiency awards are given out at the local, state and national levels.

Ten Firelands FFA members applied for eleven district awards categories in January. All ten applications placed either first or second in the district, all of the applications were ranked at the state level with five applications being selected as top four in state. The top four in state participants had to create displays for the Hall of Champions at the Ohio Expo Center in Columbus that were viewed by about 7,000 FFA members and guests of the State FFA Convention. They interviewed with judges and were placed. They crossed the stage and placings were announced.



Amanda Spears is a junior, the daughter of Jim and Margie Spears of Wellington, placed second in Diversified Horticultural Placement for her work at Hook's Greenhouse. Jessica Zurcher, a senior and the daughter of Chris and Robin Zurcher of Amherst, placed 4th in state in Outdoor Recreation Placement for her work at Common Grounds. Chrissy Balint a junior works at Dodd's Hillcrest Orchard and Emma Northeim a senior works at Rex Gee's Orchard and both applied for the Fruit Production Placement Proficiency. Chrissy is the daughter of Tom and Darlene Balint of Huron and she earned second in state. Emma, the daughter of Scott and Joy Northeim will move on to the national proficiency contest because she earned first in state! Jessica Zurcher also applied for a Poultry Production Proficiency because she raises fancy chickens, meat chickens, turkeys, geese, ducks, pigeons, and owns a dove release business. Jessica earned first in state and will compete at nationals this summer! The accomplishments of these young ladies set a school record for the number of state finalists and state winners. Congratulations, ladies! The advisor of the Firelands FFA is Mrs. Shanna Finnegan.

The varsity baseball team ended the season with a 17-12 record. After starting the season 2-3 in the PAC, the Falcons won 11 straight to finish 13-3 for second place. The record earned the team a second seed in our

twelve team district. After a first round bye, the team found itself down 11-4 to defending champion Padua in the bottom of the seventh. The Falcons then pulled out an eight run inning with contributions from all players in the lineup. The team was then knocked out by this year's district champion Holy Name 7-4. Brett Helton was named pitcher of the year, Joe San Felippo hitter of the year, Dylan Schramm and Justin Baumann won different sportsmanship awards, Dylan also won most improved and tough out awards. Brett Helton and Joe San Felippo both earned Chad Maley player of the year awards. Joe San Felippo also earned conference MVP and Lorain County DII player of the year awards. Brett, Joe, and Dylan were each first team conference selections, and cole Sklarek made second team. Brett and Joe played in the Lorain County all-star game, and Justin and Dylan played in the Greater Cleveland All Star Game. Brett and Dylan will play in the Northeast Ohio All Star Game at Progressive Field on June 25th, and Joe will play in the Mizuno All Ohio All Star Game in Columbus on June 14-15. Joe also raised money and encouraged 60 high school teams to donate autographed team hats to children with cancer. For his efforts Joe was honored with the Mike Garcia award from the Cleveland Indians Wahoo Club for community service.

Varsity Track

The Boys and Girls Track season had a very successful ending. The Boys were the 2013 PAC Track Champions. They scored 114.5 points in defeating second place Buckeye. Buckeye had been the only Boys Champion until this year. The boys were led by many outstanding performances: Dakota Dodge won the 110 HH and Jordan Ruffner won the 400 Meter run. Firelands JV Softball team had one its best seasons in memory, finishing 15-3 and finishing first in the STARS Division and second in the PAC. Two of those losses were by a run with 2 outs in the last at bats, but 10 of their wins were by mercy rule. They also batted around 21 times averaging 14 runs per game in their 15 wins, finishing the season with a 20-0 win over Lutheran West. One of the stars was pitching and hitting sensation Hannah Hicks, who lead the team in strikeouts with 46, threw a no-hitter & a one hitter in posting a 6-1 record. She also led the team in triples with 3 and posted a .575 batting average and a .854 slugging percentage. The lead hitter was Sam Hribal with an incredible .654 average and an astounding .970 slugging percentage. Sam also lead the team in ERA and posted a 5-2 record. Right behind her was Rachel Minek with a powerful .893 slugging percentage and was the team leader in RBI's (39), doubles (9), triples (3), and home runs (3), as well as playing a dazzling shortstop. With only 2 seniors on the varsity and 5 very talented 8th graders coming up, Firelands is looking to be a force to be reckoned with for the next several years.

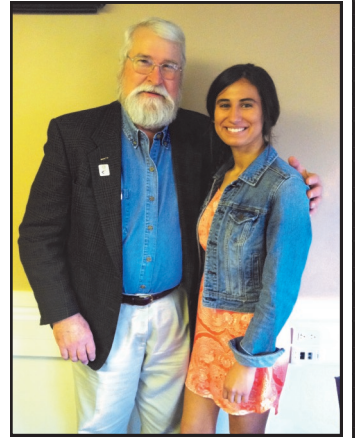

State of Ohio Immunization Requirements

Attention: Parents/Guardians of students entering school:

If your child will be entering school for the first time, or after attending school elsewhere, please be sure to check that he/she is in compliance with State of Ohio immunization requirements before the school year begins. **For the 2013-14 school year, this includes students entering grades 7, 8, 9 and 10 being required to have a diphtheria-tetanus-pertussis booster (DTP or Tdap).** Take your child's immunization records with you when you go to your regular healthcare provider, or to one of the health department walk-in child immunization clinics; check <http://www.loraincountyhealth.com/immunizations#children> for dates, times, locations, or call 440-322-6367. No one is turned away from a health department clinic because of inability to pay. Please send a copy of the updated immunization record to the school nurse in your child's building, being sure your child's name is on it. Don't forget to keep a copy for yourself!

Buckle up Bowl

Firelands Teen Leadership Corp. is proud to say that our high school competed in the Buckle up Bowl. Firelands was surveyed once in April, which showed us that 89% of our high school students do use their seat belts. TLC then found ways to get the other students attention and convince them to be safe and use their seat belts by hanging posters, making announcement's, and asking for seat belt "selfies" in return for a draw string bag with book marks, air fresheners, temporary tattoos, and a paper book cover. After all of our work to get students to buckle up we were surveyed again in May. The number of students using their seat belts went up to an amazing 91% making us the number one school competing in the Buckle up Bowl. We also found that we use our seat belts 10% more than Lorain County.



SAMS Service Project

On May 20, 2013, the 8th grade students at South Amherst Middle School participated in a service day. Morning activities included lessons and group activities on why service is important, what students can do to perform service inside and outside of school, and writing activities on the "pay it forward" philosophy. After lunch, the students completed two service projects. Groups visited the Evergreen Cemetery across the street to ready the grounds for Memorial Day. Students were supervised by village volunteers to perform various tasks including trash and litter removal, flower planting, weed pulling, headstone sweeping, and brick moving.
