New Superintendent Selected

On May 11, the Board of Education selected Mike Von Gunten to serve as the district's next superintendent starting August 1, 2015. He was awarded a three-year contract through July 2018. Mr. Von Gunten is a third-generation graduate of the school system and currently serves as the Director of Educational Services for Firelands, where he has worked for the past three years. Previously he served as a school counselor and an administrator at Olmsted Falls High School. Mike began his career as a middle school math teacher in the Elvria City Schools.

Mike is married and has two sons, ages 8 and 11, as well as a newborn daughter. He resides in the District and his sons attend Firelands Elementary School. FLS Board President, Dr. Jane Battig commented, "The Board was looking for a strong leader who could continue the excellent progress the District has made over the past three years and Mike is committed to seeing that happen. In the end, he was definitely the best fit for the position and his strong ties to the community will serve us well for many years to come."

The ESC of Lorain County conducted the search. The ESC received 23 applications, interviewed 19, and recommended six candidates for the Board to interview. The Board conducted first round interviews and three candidates were invited back for a second round interview with a 15-member District committee with representation from teachers, classified, and administrative employees, many of which are parents and/or residents of the District, as well as an outside parent representative.

It has truly been my pleasure to serve as the Firelands Superintendent for the past three years. I am proud of what we have accomplished and want to thank the District leadership team for their support and hard work directing the changes we made to improve the District. I wish a heartfelt thank you to the teachers and support staff for your tremendous efforts in serving our students on a daily basis. In addition, to our students—you are the best!

I was blessed to work with five fantastic board members who truly care about doing what is best for the students of our community. I am confident that the District will continue to prosper under the leadership of Mike Von Gunten.

HS Track

The high school track team capped a great season off at the Regional Track Meet in Lexington. The team sent multiple runners in both boys and girls events at Regionals. On their way to regionals the girls team finished as conference runners -up and the boys won their 3rd consecutive championship. There have been personal records broken and lots of improvement by all of the athletes. Dalaney Rogala, Jordan Ruffner, and Derek Reynolds have all been recognized as runners of the week by either the Journal or Chronicle. Some highlights of the year were Brennan Crawford running a 9:43 3200m to win PAC, The boys 4x800 of Cullen Grude, Jordan Ruffner, Patrick Brightbill, & Derek Reynolds running the 3rd fastest time in school history 8:08. Faith Rico setting the high jump school record at 5'5". Dalaney Rogala qualifying for Regionals in 3 events: 200, HJ, & LJ. The girls 4x800 of Erica Wasem, Jess Beran, Megan Vaughn, & Tori Hritsko qualifying for Regionals. Derek Reynolds finished 5th at regionals in the 800m with a 1:57. The 4x200 Relay of Aaron Alston, Colin Myers, Jordan Ruffner, & Cole Lewis set the school record with a 1:32.8. Congratulations to Coach Greg Northeim who was named the PAC Coach of the Year. He finished his career with conference championships his last 3 vears.

HS Softball

Playing in a tough conference with powerhouses Keystone and Columbia has not held the varsity team back from a strong season. The team finished 17-11. They demonstrated great improvement. They finished third in the PAC Stars Division with a 10-5 record in conference play behind firstplace Keystone and second-place Wellington. The team has used a good offense to complement pitchers Samantha Hribal and Claire Vilagi. Hribal and Vilagi provide a righty-lefty duo that leaves teams off-balance. Eight Falcons hit above .300, led by Vilagi, who was hitting .409. Catcher Alex Willis followed with a .405 average and third baseman Alexis Shick led the team in power categories. The team is hit a collective above .300 average. The JV team has also finished the season on a tear. After starting slow out of the gate the JV team has raced to a 10-4 record. The team is led by the pitching of Madison Palmer on the mound who has been dominating opponents at bat. The softball teams look to improve upon this season and continue to become a dominant program in the Lorain County Softball scene.

HS Baseball

The Varsity baseball team clinched a share of the Patriot

Athletic Conference Stars Division Championship with a 7-0 win over Clearview in the final conference game of the season. The Falcons finished conference play with a 13-3 record tying them with Keystone for the championship. This is the first baseball conference championship for the Falcons since 2005 and their first in the Patriot Athletic Conference. The Falcons improved their record to 18-6 on the season. The team has been led by the strong play of the senior class mixed with great performances by underclassmen pitchers and field players. The team made a nice run in the tournament defeating Bay and Keystone before falling 4-3 to #1 Holy Name in the district semi-final. The JV team has had a very strong season as well with a record of 16-6. The team is comprised of mainly freshmen with a handful of strong sophomores. The future looks bright for the Falcon baseball program.







Firelands Local School District Joins The Clean Fuels for Schools Initiative!

(Oberlin, Ohio, April 20, 2015) -- Firelands Local School District has approved a change in its school bus transportation program that promises to save thousands of dollars a year in fuel and maintenance costs while significantly reducing the district's carbon footprint.

Firelands switched from commercial grade diesel fuel to High Performance Clean Diesel ™ (HPCD), a more efficient, low-emission diesel fuel from EcoChem Alternative Fuels, LLC. EcoChem is a Dublin, Ohio company whose patent-pending fuel refinement technology was demonstrated to President Barack Obama during last months visit to Cleveland.

EcoChem and the Ohio Schools Council (OSC) are supporting a public-private partnership called the Clean Fuels for Schools Initiative TM that seeks to assist in the development and integration of best technology and best practices to improve Ohio schools' energy security, economic stewardship and environmental impact.

Firelands Transportation Director Milton Saylor called the move a "win-win" for taxpayers and for the environment. 
