FHS Boys Soccer Season Summary – 2011

After graduating 7 Seniors off of a total roster of 13 in 2010 many thought that the Falcons would be struggling to field a team. But, like every good western novel, the cavalry was on its way to the rescue. The cavalry took the form of 12 Freshmen and 3 new Sophomores coming out for the team. The overall roster sported 12 Freshmen, 6 Sophomores, and 2 Seniors. The team felt the growing pains of a young squad in the beginning of the year but finished out strong as the Falcons only lost 2 of its last 8 games. The team's overall record was 5-8-4, which is impressive considering most games there were anywhere from 7-9 Freshmen on the varsity field against Juniors/Seniors. The future is very bright as the Falcons return 9 starters as well as 15 Lettermen to the 2012 season. Some of the highlights of the season were working with the Oberlin College Men's Coach - Blake New, Attending the Akron Men's soccer game and the Oberlin College Men's soccer game, as well as winning the first tournament game in 6 years. SOPHOMORES In early December, we will be focusing on career education with the Sophomore class to assist them in the major decisions they will have to make this year about their educational path. Students will explore college preparation, college options, college Tech Prep, and vocational training programs at the JVS. We will be using the PLAN test data to assist with career planning and scheduling for their Junior year. Listed below are the scheduled dates for information sessions about what is available at the LCJVS.

JVS Presentation to Sophomores - December 9, 2011 JVS Sophomore Tour - Thursday, January 26, 2012

> JVS Open House - Sunday, February 5, 2012 1:30p.m. - 3:30p.m.

JUNIORS We will be using the Practice ACT data for college and career planning. Students will receive their results in December, and we will use the data for Senior scheduling. Students should check out the **www.actstudent.org** website. We recommend for students to take the ACT or SAT once during their Junior year, usually in the spring or early summer.

ALL SENIORS We will start putting together an 8-page Career portfolio. This portfolio will include transcripts, recommendations, and resumes. This will be done in Government Classes in

The list of local scholarships will be listed on the Firelands website. The process begins in January and runs until mid March. The information put together in the Career Portfolios can be used to fill out the scholarships.

Parents, have you had discussions about college with your high school student? Students, have you talked with your parents about your plans for after high school? If so, have these conversations raised more questions than they have answered?

The process of selecting a college to attend after high school can be daunting, from scheduling visits to completing the applications and securing the necessary financial aid.

There will be a lot of things to cover in the coming months, including applications, financial aid, and scholarships. While we are making every effort to help seniors with their college plans, we also encourage juniors and sophomores to develop a college plan by going on college visits, taking postsecondary exams such as the PSAT, PLAN, or Practice ACT and the ACT or SAT prior to the beginning of senior year.

Students and parents are welcome to make an appointment to discuss any college-related issue.



Not Forgotten Box at Firelands Elementary School




What are teens talking about at SAMS?

FES PTG HELD ANNUAL SCHOLASTIC BOOKFAIR



Ideas for Teaching Empathy/Caring

- Point out to your children both similarities and differences between them and other children. Understanding the ways that others are like them can help children behave empathetically. Knowing that others are different helps children perceive that what helps one person feel better might not help another person.
- Create an open-door atmosphere in your home so that your children feel welcome to talk about their experiences, both positive and negative. As they talk to you, behave empathetically by working to understand their feelings, expressing that understanding to them, and giving them nonverbal cues—such as leaning in and nodding—that say you are actively listening.
- Teach your children about people who are models of empathy, such as Mother Teresa, Oscar Schindler, Clara Barton, and Mahatma Gandhi.
