## CONSISTENCY IS THE KEY!

2013 - 2014 FIRELANDS BUS ROUTES
There are a few routes that have changed slightly. Students that do not ride the bus to school on the first day will need to check with their teacher or the office to find the correct bus number to ride home in the afternoon. Please do not assume that they ride the same bus home as last year. You will find the A.M. routes listed by township, bus driver, drivers name and tentative bus number. If the Bus that arrives at your house is different than what is published, the driver will instruct the students of the proper number. Please remember these times are approximate and may vary especially the first week or two of school. We ask that you have your child ready ahead of time, and wait for the bus in a safe location, approximately 10 feet from the road. There will continue to be an emphasis on designated place of safety both before and after school. Even students on the right hand side need to stay back away from the bus and wait until the bus driver signals them before students approach the bus. For those who need to cross the road, please wait for the drivers hand signal before crossing and check traffic on your own.
All Firelands students in grades 6-12 will be transported on the High School/Middle School Routes and grades K - 5 will be transported on the elementary routes; St. Joe's students will be transported on our High School/Middle School routes A.M. and P.M., Open Door, Elyria Catholic and Summit Academy students will be transported on A.M. High School routes and P.M. will be on their own route.

Post cards will be sent out approximately one week before school with bus numbers and times to alleviate phone calls.

The 2013-2014 meal assistance form is available online under forms and links on the school website. Students will also get an updated form in their welcome pack et at the start of school. For those students already getting assistance with meals, their meal status will roll over for the first month of school. Their meal status will change to denied as of October $1^{\text {st }}$ if an updated application has not been received. Only 1 application per family is required. If you should receive a letter in August stating that your child has been approved for meal assistance through direct certification, you will not need to fill out a new application. For fee waiver, please sign the bottom portion of the direct certification letter and return to the school office. Kindergarten students are not automatically approved if you have children already receiving benefits. An updated form must be turned in. If at the start of school you have filled out a new application but have not received an aceptance or denied letter please notify Judy Baumann-Food Service Director at 440-965-5821 ext 1011. It may take at least a week for your application to be processed. Applications are processed in the order they are received.

## PAY FOR IT PROGRAM

This program will allow you to put money on your child's account, pay school fees as well as provide you with your child's lunch account balance and also a short report of what has been purchased on their account. This can be done by logging onto www.payforit.net, then follow the instructions listed. There is no fee if you only use the reporting system.
