Vision 2015-V

At the August 12 Board Meeting, Vision 2015-V was adopted by the Board. The document establishes a continuous improvement plan for the district. Each year the plan is reviewed and revised based on the school's testing data and input from residents, teachers, students, and administration. STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT

Continue Implementation of "Firelands Framework for Effective Instruction"

Over the past several years, the District worked collaboratively to develop a comprehensive model to guide instructional improvement in the classroom. We will continue to implement the framework based on the work of Dr. Robert Marzano. The implementation includes the use of common assessments and professional development targeted to address data-driven district instructional goals. In addition, the administrative staff will improve the observation/evaluation process in conjunction with the Ohio Teacher and Principal Evaluation Process (OTPES).

Continue Rollout of New State Standards

The District will continue implementation of the transition plan for the "Common Core" state standards.

TECHNOLOGY

Develop and Implement the District's Technology Plan (Year 2)

The District continues to implement a technology plan that meets the needs of a 21st Century Educational Environment, as well as improving efficiency in operations. The plan in-

cludes a replacement/life cycle for technology, installation of a district-wide phone system with classroom phones to improve safety and communication, and the installation of a wireless infrastructure.

Develop a plan to implement "Bring Your Own Technology" (BYOT)

The District will begin the process of working collaboratively with all stakeholders to create a sustainable, efficient, and effective BYOT program.

FINANCE

Continue the Plan to Assure Expenditures Do Not Exceed Revenue

The District will continue to review all expenditures to ensure efficiency and fiscal responsibility.

Maintain a Budget Process That Links Expenditures to District Goals and Initiatives

The District will continue to link all expenditures to goals and initiatives that focus on efficiency and student learning and growth.

Improve Application of Technology to BOE/District Processes

The District will continue to explore efficient operations and best practices in terms of the use of resources.

FACILITIES

Implement Year 3 of the Facility/Maintenance Plan

The District will plan and prioritize projects based on funding and necessity, a task that grows increasingly difficult with aging facilities.

Evaluate facility safety as associated with 21st century learning concepts.

The District will explore current best practices for student and building safety, including analysis of the sustainability of current facilities from a cost-benefit perspective, as well as viable options of potential facility improvements including, but not limited to new construction that creates one educational campus.

CONNECTIONS

Improve Communication

The District will research and implement the use of a community blog to engage public stakeholders in the school system.

Engage community partners in the education process. The District will begin to explore opportunities to collaborate

with key stakeholders in the community to improve student learning.

WITH THE SAFETY OF YOUR CHILD IN MIND,

VARIABLE AND ALTERNATING DAYS WILL NOT BE ALLOWED
PLEASE HAVE VARIANCE FORMS COMPLETED AND TURNED INTO THE SCHOOL OR BUS GARAGE <u>5 DAYS</u> PRIOR TO THE EFFECTIVE DATES, SO EVERYONE IN-VOLVED MAY HAVE PROPER NOTICE OF THE CHANGE. WE ASK THAT THE CHANGE BE IN EFFECT FOR THE ENTIRE YEAR. THE CHANGE MUST BE WITHIN AN EXISTING ROUTE! YOU MUST FILL OUT A NEW FORM EACH SCHOOL YEAR. 2013 – 2014 FIRELANDS BUS ROUTES

There are a few routes that have changed slightly. Students that do not ride the bus to school on the first day will need to check with their teacher or the office to find the correct bus number to ride home in the afternoon. Please do not assume that they ride the same bus home as last year. You will find the A.M. routes listed by township, bus driver, drivers name and tentative bus number. If the Bus that arrives at your house is different than what is published, the driver will instruct the students of the proper number. Please remember these times are approximate and may vary especially the first week or two of school. We ask that you have your child ready ahead of time, and wait for the bus in a safe location, approximately 10 feet from the road. There will continue to be an emphasis on designated place of safety both before and after school. Even students on the right hand side need to stay back away from the bus and wait until the bus driver signals them before students approach the bus. For those who need to cross the road, please wait for the drivers hand signal before crossing and check traf-

All Firelands students in grades 6 - 12 will be transported on the High School/Middle School Routes and grades K - 5 will be transported on the elementary routes; St. Joe's students will be transported on our High School/Middle School routes A.M. and P.M., Open Door, Elyria Catholic and Summit Academy students will be transported on A.M. High School routes and P.M. will
