



It is imperative that our students are doing all that they can to gain, implement, and apply new knowledge being taught in the classroom. With the spring OAA testing season quickly approaching our staff is taking the necessary steps to maintain our building designation of 'Excellent with Distinction'. We are very proud of being "Excellent with Distinction" and know that our students and community have been a pivotal influence in the educational process to gain this honor. Thank you for your continued support of South Amherst Middle School.

The focus for the building is to achieve and make progress for every student in the building. At a minimum, we should expect each student to progress one academic year in one year's time. Students, who are academically behind, must grow more than one academic year in one year's time to close the gap. Progress is often referred to as value added. Value added provides a picture of student growth regardless of students' achievement levels. Value-added can help us understand whether high-achieving students are making enough progress to sustain or even improve their achievement levels. Value-added can also help us understand whether low-achieving students are making enough progress to close the proficiency gap. Achievement and Value added is defined as the Power of Two, as depicted by the Venn Diagram below:



We have recently completed our Mock OAA testing and the data from those tests have given the teaching staff a clear picture of our student's needs. It is vital that we focus on each student and deliver intervention or enrichment to add value to their learning this school year. Please make sure you are aware of the upcoming testing dates.
