How do you define student success? Too often, schools are ranked and sorted and then praised or condemned based entirely on student test scores which are compiled onto a district report card. While Firelands was one of three districts in our county to receive an overall grade of a "B" on our most recent report card, only a small portion of our students' achievement and growth can be measured via state tests. If you would like to view our report card you may do so by visiting reportcard.education.ohio.gov; however, a far more authentic means of understanding all that Firelands offers is to visit our 2nd Annual Falcon Showcase on March 7th from 6:30-8:00 pm in the Firelands High School Gym. 
The following snapshots are just some of the many examples of our students' accomplishments:



The 24 Game is a mental math game of speed and accuracy that challenges students to arrive at the number 24 using a card with a given 4 numbers and any of the operations addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division. Seven of our top math students at FES love this challenge and worked hard to make it to a 24 competition event hosted by the Educational Service Center of Lorain County on February 7th. After some tough competition against 6 area schools, three of those students went on to the finals, along with only two other districts! Our semi-finalists include fifth graders Colton Clough, Max Dougan, Lilly Chenoweth, Micah Lee, and fourth graders Alexander Duke, Maggie Tansey, and Josie Kirby. Our robotics team at South Amherst Middle School designs, builds, programs and competes in official VEX Robotic competitions. Brownhelm, OH – On November 10th, the Lorain County 4-H Small Equine High Point Banquet was held in Avon. Two Four Leaf Clovers 4-H members were invited to the banquet for qualifying for high point awards. Katelyn Konicek was recognized for earning 5th in Lorain County in Miniature Horse Gelding Halter B. Callie Finnegan was recognized for being County Champion of In-Hand Trail, Reserve Champion Showmanship, and 5th in Miniature Horse Mare Halter B. She also earned a duffle bag for her successes at Ohio State Fair, Ohio 4-H Skillathon, State Communications Contest, State Horse Bowl, Ohio Hippology, and Ohio Horse Judging.

On January 13^{th} , the Lorain County Saddle Horse Banquet was held in Wellington. Macy Paller was recognized for being on the 8th in State Horse Bowl Team and as 3^{rd} overall/Honorable Mention in Beginner Showmanship, 5^{th} overall in Walk Trot Western Pleasure, and 5^{th} in Walk Trot Horsemanship.

Callie Finnegan was recognized at this banquet as well for state achievements and also for earning Reserve Champion in 9-13 year old Showmanship, Reserve Champion Walk Trot English Equitation, Reserve Champion Walk Trot English Pleasure, Champion Walk Trot Western Pleasure, Champion Walk Trot Western Horsemanship, and Honorable Mention 9-18 year old Ground Roping. At the end of the banquet she was awarded the revolving trophy as the Champion Walk Trot Horseman for 2018. This award is presented to the 4-H participant with the most accumulative points in 1st year or Age Division Showmanship W/T English Equitation, W/T English Pleasure, W/T Western Horsemanship, and W/T Western Pleasure. Callie joins Four Leaf Clovers 4-H Club alumni, Callie Stevens 2010 and Shelby Balint 2011 in having her name added to the trophy.

Assistance is Available

Short-term or long-term breakfast and lunch assistance is available, with application, for FLSD families.

Firelands Schools has implemented an online portal for meal assistance. Parents/Guardians can quickly and easily fill out free and reduced meal applications in a secure, step-by-step portal. You may apply any time after July 1 or during the school year. The step by step instructions are listed below. You will need the student I.D. to register (same student number as PowerSchool). You will be asked to complete the following steps:

- •Enter your first and last name along with a password you create
- •Complete the required information
- •Click finish
- •It will take you back to the Log-in screen

Firelands Local Schools will be utilizing our online registration system for all new Kindergarten students starting on March 4th. Kindergarten families can register using our online system, Firelands OneView, by accessing the Firelands website at www.firelandsschools.org.

Click on the "Student Registration" tab found on the left side of the home page. Then, click the "Firelands OneView Portal" link located above the diagram. Click the "Create a New Account" button to get started. The set-up process includes you creating your own username and password to log in to the system. The district does not provide that information.

FHS Art Students Exhibit in the 2019 Regional Scholastic Art Show

The Lorain County Regional Scholastic Art Exhibition has been providing a program to recognize, exhibit and honor excellence in visual art from 7-12 grade students for over 50 years. The 2019 exhibition kicked off Jan. 15 and includes 28 works from 13 of our students!

The Scholastic Art Awards program is the largest annual art competition in the country. Students in schools across the United States and Canada create the 150,000 entries each year. The Lorain County region includes public and private middle and high schools from Lorain, Erie and Huron counties. Over 1.709 works were entered by 20 high schools and 12 junior high schools from the three counties. Work was juried by an esteemed panel of art and design professionals and professors from northeast Ohio. Work was judged by originality, technical skill and emergence of personal vision and voice. Grade 7-8 students compete in one division

with all categories mixed. The high school students are competing together, grades 9-12, at the "varsity level" within various separate media categories. Students earn third place "Honorable Mention", second place "Silver Key" and the first place of "Gold Key". Placing among the 550 pieces in this show is like placing in "districts" in sports. Those works earning a regional "Gold Key" here advance directly to national jurying in New York City this spring.

The exhibit is hosted at the Stocker Center gallery on the campus of Lorain County Community College and sponsored by the Nordson Corporation with additional funding from the C. Paul Stocker Arts Foundation

and Lorain County Community College. The exhibit runs from Jan. 15 – Feb. 22 and is open to the public. A special reception for all artists is was held Jan. 13. A Gold Key awards ceremony and reception was held on Feb. 10 for the Gold Key winners. Beth K. Stocker Gallery hours are Mon. - Fri. 10:30-2:30 with Tues., Wed., and Thurs. evenings 4-6:30pm and Sundays 1-5. The gallery is also open during Stocker Center Hoke

Resources are organized by grade levels. To get started visit www.infohio.org, choose the level that is right for your child. To view all the resources, click the menu in the upper right-hand corner. Click "resources" or "parents" to access all the resources available in those links.

The parent tab provides more information on the resources and services from INFOhio. Parents can find answers to common questions and links to helpful webpages and resources. It also provides information about college and career readiness. For example: there is a link to College Credit Plus resources for students and parents that provides tools and strategies to guide your child through the process.

The "Beach Bags" and other web tools you see in the Summer Learning section, give parents an easy way to help their child practice their reading skills and combat the summer slide. They are also good to use on those rainy or snowy days when children are experiencing cabin-fever.

If you have the opportunity, take time to check out the INFOhio link and discover a wealth of resources that can help you and your child with their schoolwork or just research more on their favorite topics. INFOhio 's vision states that each Ohio PreK-12 student has equal access to high-quality digital resources for a successful education and future!

SCHOOL IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS FOR 2018 - 2019

It is now time to update your child's immunizations. If your child will be entering school for the first time, or after attending school elsewhere, please be sure to check that he/she is in compliance with State of Ohio immunization requirements:

<u>Kindergarten</u> – once your child has reached age 4, s/he can complete all required immunizations for diphtheria, pertussis, tetanus (DPT), polio (IPV), hepatitis B (HBV), measles mumps, rubella (MMR), and varicella (chickenpox).

- ♦ <u>Grades 1-6</u> same requirements as for Kindergarten
- Grades 7-9 Grades K-6 requirements plus Tdap (DPT booster) and MCV (meningococcal vaccine)
- Grades 10-11 Grades K-6 requirements plus Tdap (received in 7th grade or later)
- ◆ Grade 12 Grades 10-11 requirements plus MCV (must be received at age 16 or older)

Remember to bring your child's immunization records with you when you go to your healthcare provider or clinic. Please send a copy of the immunization record to the school nurse in your

child's building, being sure your child's name is on it. Don't forget to keep a copy for yourself! **Lorain County Public Health**, 9880 S. Murray Ridge Rd., Elyria, OH 44035 is now offering immunizations (also known as vaccines) Monday through Friday, 8:30 am – 3:30 pm, with evening hours throughout the month. A full vaccine clinic schedule is available at

www.LorainCountyHealth.com. Appointments are encouraged, although walk-ins are accepted. Call 440-284-3206 for information or to make an appointment for both children and adults. Bring all immunization records, insurance cards, and cash or check; although some children may be eligible for discounts under the Vaccines for Children (VFC) program. All children under age 18 must be accompanied by a parent or guardian.

Note: Ask your provider about additional vaccines that are recommended for children ages 11-19 such as 2^{nd} dose of varicella (chickenpox), hepatitis A and human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccines.

2019-20 SCHEDULING HAS BEGUN -

Counselors will be meeting with students in classes to help students decide which courses they would like to enroll in for the 2019-20 school year. Students are encouraged to speak with their parents, counselors, and teachers to decide which courses will help them reach their goals for high school and beyond.

THE LORAIN COUNTY LEAGUE—

Firelands High School will be moving to the Lorain County League, beginning with the upcoming 2019-20 school year. The Patriot Athletic League will be no more, but the LC8, which is the logo of the Lorain County League, will allow Firelands to keep all of our county rivalries, and will create a league with one division. Joining Firelands will be Black River, Brookside, Clearview, Columbia, Keystone, Oberlin, and Wellington. The league kicks off this fall, so look for new LC8 media outlets to promote our students and league. The original Lorain County League was formed in 1924, and was represented by Brownhelm, Camden, Kipton, Henrietta, and South Amherst. The league broke up in 1961. but came together again in 1986, until the Falcons left in 2005 to join the WSC. This will be the third start-up of a solid, small school league for Lorain County.

All JVS Juniors are expected to take the free SAT at Firelands High School on Wednesday, March 6th, beginning at 7:30 am.

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
