Along with pursuing educational excellence, we work with our students to develop Character, Competence and Commitment. During the holidays, it is especially wonderful to see our students and staff assisting our community in the following ways:

Firelands Elementary School FES: Not Forgotten Box



FES students supported the Chronicle Telegram's Not Forgotten Box. They collected 600 new toys, books, games, stuffed animals, and art supplies for babies, children, and teens of all ages.

FES: Food Drive



FES collected and donated over 2000 pounds of foods to Second Harvest Food Bank. This donation will provide 1850 meals for local families.

Art Teacher, Mrs. Proehl, once again created handmade ornaments that were raffled off at the December winter concert at FES. Money raised will be used to benefit local children in need.

South Amherst Middle School SAMS: Troop Drive

The Firelands Local School District will be accepting open enrollment applications for the **2019 - 2020** school year beginning on **Monday, February 4, 2019 and ending on July 1, 2019.** The doors will open at **7:30 am** at the Board of Education Office, 112 North Lake St., South Amherst, for parents to complete the Open Enrollment application/s. Firelands Open Enrollment is tuition free, however parents are responsible for their child's school fees.

Parents from <u>ANY SCHOOL DISTRICT</u> in Ohio are welcome to apply for their child/children. **SPACE IS LIMITED AND WILL BE AWARDED ON A FIRST COME, FIRST SERVED BASIS**.

If a grade level closes, we still encourage parents to complete the open enrollment application, and those children are placed on a "waiting list", until those seats are made available.



Assistance is Available

Short-term or long-term breakfast and lunch assistance is available, with application, for FLSD families.

Firelands Schools has implemented an online portal for meal assistance. Parents/ Guardians can quickly and easily fill out free and reduced meal applications in a secure, step-by-step portal. Kindergarten Registration

Firelands Local Schools will be utilizing our online registration system for all new Kindergarten students starting on March 4th. Kindergarten families can register using our online system, Firelands OneView, by accessing the Firelands website at www.firelandsschools.org.

Click on the "Student Registration" tab found on the left side of the home page. Then, click the "Firelands OneView Portal" link located above the diagram. Click the "Create a New Account" button to get started. The set-up process includes you creating your own username and password to log in to the system. The district does not provide that information.

Beginning March 4th, you can complete the registration at home by using the link above, or you may attend one of the following registration events at the Firelands Board of Education, located at 112 North Lake Street in South Amherst to complete the registration process:

Monday, March 4th 8:00 AM-12:00 PM

Tuesday, March 5th 1:00 PM-5:00 PM

Wednesday, March 6th 3:30 PM-7:30 PM

If you are planning to attend one of the registration events listed above at the Firelands Board of Education, please bring your child's birth certificate, 2 proofs of residency, parent/guardian photo id, shot records, and custody papers (if they apply).

Firelands Local Schools Construction Update:

In November 2018, the community passed a 4.28 mil bond issue that calls for the construction of a new 9-12 grade high school. The existing high school will be re-purposed as the middle school and Board of Education. The new building will be built on district owned property, just North of the existing high school.

In December 2018, 9.9 million dollars of notes for this project were sold and the beginning phases of site work scheduled.

Work being done in January includes:

- Phase 1 Environmental Assessment
- Wetland Delineation
- Geotechnical Report
- Site Survey



Dangers of E-Cigarettes/Juul



What you may not know, however, is that all Juul e-cigarettes have a high level of nicotine. A single Juul pod contains as much nicotine as a pack of (20) regular cigarettes.

Juul's are shaped like a USB Flash Drive to help teens hide the product. This design element was quickly copied by other manufactures for additional products, including marijuana.

<u> Mobile Dentist Announcement</u>

The Smiles Program/Mobile Dentists will be at Firelands Elementary on Friday, February 15, 2019, to serve our elementary school students. A local, licensed Dentist and Hygienist will provide a comprehensive dental exam which includes: X-rays, cleaning, fluoride, sealants, fillings, baby tooth extractions, pulpotomy and stainless steel crowns - all this in just a short time away from the classroom. *Parents are not required to be present, but are certainly welcomed and encouraged to be there.* Most insurance plans, including Medicaid, cover 100% of the services that are provided. If you do not have insurance, you may still be able to participate in the program at reduced rates or no charge. **Permission forms were sent home with students on Thursday, January 10, 2019. They must be completed and returned to the school by Thursday, February 7, 2019, or parents may go online at www.myschooldentist.com to make an appointment for their child.**

SCHOOL IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS FOR 2018 - 2019

It is now time to update your child's immunizations. If your child will be entering school for the first time, or after attending school elsewhere, please be sure to check that he/she is in compliance with State of Ohio immunization requirements:

<u>Kindergarten</u> – once your child has reached age 4, s/he can complete all required immunizations for diphtheria, pertussis, tetanus (DPT), polio (IPV), hepatitis B (HBV), measles mumps, rubella (MMR), and varicella (chickenpox).

- ♦ <u>Grades 1-6</u> same requirements as for Kindergarten
- <u>Grades 7-9</u> Grades K-6 requirements plus Tdap (DPT booster) and MCV (meningococcal vaccine)
- ♦ Grades 10-11 Grades K-6 requirements plus Tdap (received in 7th grade or later)
- ◆ Grade 12 Grades 10-11 requirements plus MCV (must be received at age 16 or older)

Remember to bring your child's immunization records with you when you go to your healthcare provider or clinic. Please send a copy of the immunization record to the school nurse in your child's building, being sure your child's name is on it. Don't forget to keep a copy for yourself!

Lorain County Public Health, 9880 S. Murray Ridge Rd., Elyria, OH 44035 is now offering immunizations (also known as vaccines) Monday through Friday, 8:30 am - 3:30 pm, with evening hours throughout the month. A full vaccine clinic schedule is available at

www.LorainCountyHealth.com. Appointments are encouraged, although walk-ins are accepted. Call 440-284-3206 for information or to make an appointment for both children and adults. Bring all immunization records, insurance cards, and cash or check; although some children may be eligible for discounts under the Vaccines for Children (VFC) program. All children under age 18 must be accompanied by a parent or guardian.

Note: Ask your provider about additional vaccines that are recommended for children ages 11-19 such as 2^{nd} dose of varicella (chickenpox), hepatitis A and human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccines.

FOURTH GRADE VISITS THE NATURAL HISTORY MUSEUM

The fourth grade went to The Natural History Museum in Cleveland on Monday, December 3rd. The students saw a program called "Indian Star Stories" and were able to explore the museum, see dinosaur bones, see artifacts from Ohio's ancient people, learn about the flight of birds, and much more. The fourth grade would like to thank the PTG for providing the busing and the bus drivers for driving them, so they could attend the museum and have this wonderful experience.



MOCK TRIAL EXPERIENCE

On December 6th, Mrs. Dempsey's 5th grade gifted reading class participated in a Mock Trial experience sponsored by the Educational Service Center of Lorain County. The event was held at the Lorain County Justice Center in Elyria, where gifted classes in grades 5 through 8 from area school districts met to try their cases in real courtrooms, with real judges and attorneys who were willing to share their time and expertise with the students.

Students worked hard to prepare for mock trial. Critical thinking was crucial to studying the case as they discovered facts and evidence used to question witnesses. Learning courtroom terminology, witness examination, forming objections, and creating opening and closing statements were all challenging, but exciting parts of the process. Magistrate Adam Bryda of the Lorain County Court System visited the classroom to work closely with the students and offer advice about the trial process.

On the day of the field trip, the class stepped into the courtroom as 5 young defense attorneys. They prepared opening and closing statements, as well as questions for direct and cross exam of 6 witnesses. The defense attorneys confidently played their parts, which demanded listening closely for details and demonstrated their ability to think on their feet. One student was thrilled to have his objection sustained! Other students served as jurors on criminal cases tried by other participating schools, and a few students even

participated as sketch artists in each courtroom. What a rewarding way to learn about our judicial system and also about future career possibilities!
