FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT

In this month's edition of the Firelands Express, I am pleased to highlight just a few of the accomplishments of our dedicated staff. Our District is truly fortunate to have such wonderful, caring people work with our students.



Steve Lias has been employed with Firelands since 1999 as a high school science teacher. On March 24th, Mr. Lias was inducted into the Lorain County Basketball Coaches Hall of Fame during the Boys All-Star games at Avon Lake High School. Coach Lias was the Head Boys Basketball Coach at Firelands for 12 years, as well as serving as a former Athletic Director at Firelands High School. Coach Lias started his career as the Head Coach at Elyria Catholic, where he led the Panthers to a Division II Regional berth, before coming to

Firelands in 1999. Coach Lias led the Falcons to a Sectional Final game in 2002 against LeBron James and Akron St. Vincent-St. Mary and later led the Falcons to Lorain County Conference titles in both 2003 and 2005. Coach Lias remains the Head Track Coach, Assistant Cross-Country Coach, and teaches Science at FHS, including the Lorain County Community College Anatomy and Physiology courses. Congratulation Coach Lias on this much deserved honor.



Coach Ken Davis has been the Falcon's bowling coach for the majority of the program's existence, beginning with the 2001 season. Coach Davis recently received the 2019 North Shore Bowling Conference Coach of the Year Award. Although Coach Davis announced he is resigning after 18 years, he has committed to returning next year to help with the



transition to a new coach. Thanks to coach Davis for being a wonderful role model for our student athletes.



Service best describes the life of Mrs. Annie Knoble. Mrs. Knoble has retired after keeping the official book for Firelands Boys Basketball for 27 years. In addition, Mrs. Knoble volunteered in the boosters concession stand for 18 years and was a 4H advisor for 35 years. FIRELANDS LOCAL SCHOOL DISTRICT ACCEPTING OPEN ENROLLMENT APPLICATIONS FOR THE 2019 - 2020 SCHOOL YEAR

The Firelands Local School District is now accepting open enrollment applications for the 2019 - 2020 school year beginning on Monday, February 4, 2019 and ending on July 1, 2019. Firelands Open Enrollment is tuition free, however parents are responsible for their child's school fees.

Parents from <u>ANY SCHOOL DISTRICT</u> in Ohio are welcome to apply for their child/children. SPACE IS LIMITED AND WILL BE AWARDED ON A FIRST COME, FIRST SERVED BASIS.

If a grade level closes, we still encourage parents to complete the open enrollment application, and those children are placed on a "waiting list", until those seats are made available.

School Immunization Requirements for 2019-2020

Attention: If your child will be entering 12th grade, 7th grade or any grade for the first time -- it is now time to update immunizations. If entering school for the first time, or after attending school elsewhere, please be sure to check that your child is in compliance with State of Ohio immunization requirements:

Kindergarten – once your child has reached age 4, s/he can complete all required immunizations for diphtheria, pertussis, tetanus (DPT), polio (IPV), hepatitis B (HBV), measles mumps, rubella (MMR), and varicella (chickenpox). If possible, have them done and bring a copy of the record to Kindergarten screening in May.

•Grades 1-6 – same requirements as for Kindergarten

18 must be accompanied by a parent or guardian.

- •Grades 7-10 Grades K-6 requirements plus Tdap (DPT booster) and MCV (meningococcal vaccine)
- •Grade 11 Grades K-6 requirements plus Tdap (received in 7th grade or later)
- •Grade 12 Grade 11 requirements plus MCV (must be received at age 16 or older)

Remember to bring your child's immunization records with you when you go to your healthcare provider or clinic. Please send a copy of the immunization record to the school nurse in your child's building, being sure your child's name is on it. Don't forget to keep a copy for yourself!

Lorain County Public Health, 9880 S. Murray Ridge Rd., Elyria, OH 44035 is now offering immunizations (also known as vaccines) Monday through Friday, 8:30 am – 3:30 pm, with evening hours throughout the month. A full vaccine clinic schedule is available at **www.LorainCountyHealth.com**. Appointments are encouraged, although walk-ins are accepted. Call **440-284-3206** for information or to make an appointment for both children and adults. Bring all immunization records, insurance cards, and cash or check; although some children may be eligible for discounts under the Vaccines for Children (VFC) program. All children under age

SUCCESS - Thank you to everyone that helped to make the Feel the Love Food Drive a big success. Firelands FFA, Firelands Alumni, & Firelands Schools is proud to announce the final statistics of the drive at FHS. The food will be weighed upon delivery but is estimated to weigh 2000 lbs. A ton of food has a retail value of about \$3,340 according to Feeding America. The donation from FHS will provide about 1700 meals to those in need in our community. Firelands Elementary donated nearly 1000 lbs, worth about \$1,670 that will provide over 830 meals. Congratulations to Mrs. Finnegan's class for bringing in 428 non-perishables. Ohio Governor's Youth Regional <u>Art Exhibition</u>

The Ohio Governor's Youth Art Exhibition, now in its forty-ninth year, is dedicated to the educational and artistic advancement of our talented young people in the state of Ohio. The exhibition is open to all of Ohio's 1,112 high schools, both public and private, or chartered by the State of Ohio Department of Education.

The process of selecting artworks for the state exhibition begins on a regional level. The state is divided into 14 regional locations, with high school students in each region invited to enter work in that regional judging. Firelands participates in a massive region that starts in Lorain County and extends eastward all the way to Pennsylvania encompassing all high schools in Cuyahoga, Lake, Summit, Geauga and Medina counties. Regional judging took place Mar. 2 at North Olmsted High School. Over 1600 works were submitted in this region alone. Only 200 works are selected from among the over 1600 entered at the region to advance to state judging. FHS senior Bailey Borer had two photographs

advance to represent our region; "Eyes" and "Pickaboo".

The state judging takes place in Columbus; however, the judges for this level of competition are chosen from all over the country and are generally professional artists, college level instructors, or both.

From the 11,500 regional entries from the 14 regions, approximately 2,500 are selected to enter the state judging. State jurors then select

300 for the actual exhibition, with 25 of the 300 chosen to receive the Governor's Award of Excellence. Scholarships are offered to seniors by over 30 universities and colleges of art. Although Bailey's photographs did not get selected for the state exhibition, she is honored with inclusion in the regional exhibition and recognition program held March 23 at North Olmsted High School. 
