FIRELANDS LOCAL SCHOOLS RECEIVES AUDITOR OF STATE AWARD



The Firelands Local School District has received the Auditor of State's Award for Fiscal Year 2018. This is the 5th time the district has received this award. The award is presented for excellence in financial reporting in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles and compliance with applicable laws. The most recent financial audit of the district by the Auditor of State's office returned a clean audit report which is the requirement to receive the award. In order to receive a "clean" audit report, the following criteria must be met.

The District must file timely financial reports with Auditor of State's office in accordance with

GAAP (Generally Accepted Accounting Principles);

The audit report does not contain any findings

for recovery, material citations, material weaknesses, significant deficiencies, Single Audit findings or questioned costs; The District's management letter contains no comments related to:

- ♦ Ethics referrals
- ♦ Questioned costs less than \$10,000
- ♦ Lack of timely report submission
- ♦ Reconciliation
- ♦ Failure to obtain a timely single audit
- ♦ Findings for recovery less than \$100
- ♦ Public meetings or public records

It is always our goal to provide our community with accurate financial records and to show that we are being good stewards of their tax dollars. This award affirms that we are doing just that. A clean audit report requires hard work and dedication from everyone in the district, but I would especially like to recognize the efforts of Jennifer Sutherland (Accounts Payable) and Ann Wiegand (Payroll) who keep the Treasurer's Office running smoothly.

Construction Update

Earlier this month we received notice that our building project will be placed on the Ohio Facilities Construction Commission's (OFCC) July agenda for approval. Upon approval from the OFCC, our project will be sent to the State Controlling Board for their approval and certification of funds which is anticipated to occur by early August. Once both of these steps have been completed, the district can begin the selection process for an architect and construction manager. To date, the following site work has been completed:

- Phase 1 Environmental Assessment
- Wetland Delineation
- Geotechnical Report
- Site Survey

During the past several months we have been working alongside our bond counsel, municipal advisor and underwriters to establish a financing plan for the project. As part of that plan, we will be selling and issuing bonds in mid to late June 2019.

As our construction project progresses, updates will be posted to our district website under the "Construction Update" tab.

FIRELANDS LOCAL SCHOOL DISTRICT ACCEPTING OPEN ENROLLMENT APPLICATIONS FOR THE 2019 - 2020 SCHOOL YEAR

The Firelands Local School District is now accepting open enrollment applications for the 2019 - 2020 school year beginning on Monday, February 4, 2019 and ending on July 1, 2019. Firelands Open Enrollment is tuition free, however parents are responsible for their child's school fees.

Parents from <u>ANY SCHOOL DISTRICT</u> in Ohio are welcome to apply for their child/children. SPACE IS LIMITED AND WILL BE AWARDED ON A FIRST COME, FIRST SERVED BASIS.

If a grade level closes, we still encourage parents to complete the open enrollment application, and those children are placed on a "waiting list", until those seats are made available.

School Immunization Requirements for 2019-2020

Attention: If your child will be entering 12^{th} grade, 7^{th} grade or any grade for the first time -- it is now time to update immunizations. If entering school for the first time, or after attending school elsewhere, please be sure to check that your child is in compliance with State of Ohio immunization requirements:

Kindergarten – once your child has reached age 4, s/he can complete all required immunizations for diphtheria, pertussis, tetanus (DPT), polio (IPV), hepatitis B (HBV), measles mumps, rubella (MMR), and varicella (chickenpox). If possible, have them done and bring a copy of the record to Kindergarten screening in May.

- •Grades 1-6 same requirements as for Kindergarten
- •Grades 7-10 Grades K-6 requirements plus Tdap (DPT booster) and MCV (meningococcal vaccine)
- •Grade 11 Grades K-6 requirements plus Tdap (received in 7th grade or later)
- •Grade 12 Grade 11 requirements plus MCV (must be received at age 16 or older)

Remember to bring your child's immunization records with you when you go to your healthcare provider or clinic. Please send a copy of the immunization record to the school nurse in your child's building, being sure your child's name is on it. Don't forget to keep a copy for yourself!

Lorain County Public Health, 9880 S. Murray Ridge Rd., Elyria, OH 44035 is now offering immunizations (also known as vaccines) Monday through Friday, 8:30 am – 3:30 pm, with evening hours throughout the month. A full vaccine clinic schedule is available at **www.LorainCountyHealth.com**. Appointments are encouraged, although walk-ins are accepted. Call **440-284-3206** for information or to make an appointment for both children and adults. Bring all immunization records, insurance cards, and cash or check; although some children may be eligible for discounts under the Vaccines for Children (VFC) program. All children under age 18 must be accompanied by a parent or guardian.

Note: Ask your provider about additional vaccines that are recommended for children ages 11-19 such as 2nd dose of varicella (chickenpox), hepatitis A and human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccines.

May 10th saw the submission of Firelands High School's first ever AP Studio Art portfolios. This is an honors level course for seniors that can convert to college credit if a 3 or greater is earned. The students began their work last summer by sketching ideas and taking reference photos. They each developed their own "sustained investigation" thesis of their own design. They each also had to present a range of unrelated works that demonstrate the breadth of their skills and creativity using a variety of media. All works were photographed and submitted online. Additionally, the 2D students mailed in 5 original pieces for in-person grading. Students will find out their scores by early July. Wish them 5's!
