# FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT



As we enter the final weeks of 2016-2017 school year, I would like to thank our entire staff for their hard work and dedication to over 1600 students that attend Firelands Local School District. In addition, the support we receive from our families and countless community members is integral to our organization. As our daily lives seem to get ever busier, the commitment of those who have shared their time, talents and resources over the past year is sincerely appreciated.

As our society continues to change, and in some ways more troubling, I want to assure our community that providing our students a safe and secure learning environment is our first priority. Over the past 18 months the District has:

- ♦ Installed new security cameras at Firelands Elementary School
- ♦ Established a plan to outfit all school busses with cameras by the end of the 2018-2019 school year
- ♦ Implemented a drug testing program at the high school for our student athletes and drivers
- ♦ Invested in a visitor identification system at each of our buildings
- ♦ Hosted two educational programs for parents and community members on drug awareness and parenting in the 21<sup>st</sup> century
- ♦ Increased counseling services available to our students on campus
- ◆ Taken a step back to assess our facility challenges and how best to provide safe environments conducive to 21st century learning

Prior to school starting in August, in cooperation with the Lorain County Sheriff's Department, our entire staff will spend a half day in training and participating in an active shooter drill. While the probability of such event occurring is small, we must be prepared should the unthinkable happen.

In closing, as the Class of 2017 leaves us prepared to embark on a new chapter in their life, we are excited to welcome The Class of 2030, our incoming kindergarteners!

# Payton Burgdorf finished 4th in State!

Throughout his freshman season Firelands freshman Payton Burgdorf has had to hear about 1960. That was the last time a Firelands wrestler made it onto the podium.

But with a fourth-place finish at the 2017 OHSAA Division II state wrestling tournament on Saturday, Burgdorf ended the drought. He rallied from an opening-round loss at 106 pounds to win four consolation matches to reach the third-place match.

Payton lost to St. Paris Graham's Tanner Jordan by major decision, 15-2, in the third-place match. But the accomplishment isn't lost on the fearless Falcon Freshman. His humble approach to the meet was in true Falcon fashion as he went to work looking to represent the Firelands community on the mat.

On his way to the 3<sup>rd</sup> place match,, Burgdorf beat Christian Wayt of Beloit West Branch, 7-5 in a tiebreaker in the consolation semifinals on Saturday. On Friday he defeated Finnearthy from Circleville 3-2 and got redemption from a 7-3 loss to Ritter from Wauseon in the district championships with a 6-0 victory during the wrestle backs. On day one Payton lost his opening match to Suber from Tallmadge before starting the weekends winning streak by taking out Dima from Germantown Valley View 6-4.

All in all it was a great weekend of wrestling for Payton and the Falcon coaching staff. It was also a fantastic season for all of the Falcons as they repeated as Patriot Athletic Conference Dual-Meet Champions in 2017 capping off a great team season before the State Tournament began.

### 2017-18 Kindergarten Registrations Packet will be available at Firelands Elementary School and on our website beginning on Monday, April 3, 2017!

The registration process will begin on April 10, 2017 at FES in the main office from 8:30 a.m. - 3:30 p.m. All Kindergarten registration will be done at Firelands Elementary School until June 16, 2017.

For all other grade levels, parents can begin registering their students for the 2017 -2018 school year on Monday April 10<sup>th</sup>, from 7:30 a.m. – 3:30 p.m.

On Tuesday April 11<sup>th</sup> registration will be from 12:00 p.m.– 8:00 p.m.

Registrations after April 11<sup>th</sup> will be by appointment and only on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

#### **SCHOOL IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS FOR 2017-18**

It is now time to update your child's immunizations. If your child will be entering school for the first time, or after attending school elsewhere, please be sure to check that he/she is in compliance with State of Ohio immunization requirements:

Kindergarten – once your child has reached age 4. s/he can complete all required immunizations for diphtheria, pertussis, tetanus (DPT), polio (IPV), hepatitis B (HBV), measles mumps, rubella (MMR), and varicella (chickenpox). If possible, have them done and bring a copy of the record to Kindergarten registration May 12 - June 16, 2017 at FES.

**Grades 1-6** – same requirements as for Kindergarten

Grades 7-8 – Grades K-6 requirements plus Tdap (DPT booster) and MCV (meningococcal vaccine)

**Grades 9-11** – Grades K-6 requirements plus Tdap (received in 7th grade or later)

Grade 12 – Grades 9-11 requirements plus MCV (must be received at age 16 or older)

Remember to bring your child's immunization records with you when you go to your healthcare provider or clinic. Please send a copy of the immunization record to the school nurse in your child's building, being sure your child's name is on it. Don't forget to keep a copy for yourself!

The Lorain County General Health District (LCGHD) is now offering immunizations by appointment. Call 440-284-3206 to make an immunization appointment for children and adults. Bring all immunization records, insurance cards, and cash or check; although some children may be eligible for discounts under the Vaccines for Children (VFC) program. All children under age 18 must be accompanied by a parent or guardian.

Note: Ask your provider about additional vaccines that are recommended for children ages 11-19 such as 2<sup>nd</sup> dose of varicella (chickenpox), hepatitis A and human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccines.



# CURRICULUM UPDATE

#### **FUNDATIONS**

FUNDATIONS is coming to FES! This early literacy resource gives K -3 students a multisensory, structured language approach to reading. Fundations provides research-based materials and strategies essential to a comprehensive reading environment. Fundations makes learning to read fun while laying the groundwork for life-long literacy. Students in K-3 will increase their foundational skills emphasizing phonemic awareness, phonics, high frequency words, reading fluency, vocabulary, comprehension strategies, and handwriting. Students will have multiple opportunities for skills practice and application to build mastery in the areas mentioned above. Fundations guides

teachers to meet individual student needs by differentiating instruction and encourages parental involvement in their students learning. Fundations integrates skill instruction during the daily lessons then reinforces corresponding skills needed to master the multiple skills taught on a daily basis. Developing early literacy skills makes it easier for students to learn to read. Reading is an essential skill for success in school and later in life.

#### SUMMER READING PROGRAM

FES will host a summer reading program June 12<sup>th</sup>-June 30<sup>th</sup>. This will be an intensive program designed to enhance your child's

reading skills and to assist them in reaching their educational needs. The program will run from 8:00-11:30 daily for three weeks. Research supports that students experience learning and reading loss when they are not taking part in active education for an extended time. A summer reading program is an excellent way of forestalling such reading loss. We are hoping that the students take what they learn during the summer reading program and continue those skills as part of their summer vacation. Reinforcing these skills throughout the summer will prepare the students for entering school in the fall.



Our Firelands Senior Class of 2017 includes two Girl Scout Gold Award Recipients! Grace and Sophia Pohorence will be earning the highest award that can be earned in Girl Scouts in June of 2017 for their leadership and service to the community. The Gold Award is only earned by 3% of Girl Scouts and generally takes 200 hours of planning and implementation.

Grace Pohorence, worked with Mrs. Tawil, our high school art teacher, to identify a need in the Firelands community. Feeling strongly about the power of art as a creative

tool and stress reliever, Grace planned to implement an art camp for grades kindergarten through fifth grade. She worked hard to keep the camp at a low cost to families. Grace gathered donations to make four Adirondack chairs, taught her fellow FFA classmates the steps in building them and oversaw painting by the Firelands Art Society. She raffled the chairs to help fund the camp which was held in July 2016 for 50 students. FHS students worked as camp counselors, after taking part in months of planning, to run daily activities and an art show at the end of the week. The camp was so successful that it will be held again this summer and, hopefully, for many to come, passing along Grace's love for art to younger Firelands students!

Sophia Pohorence used a past experience to bring her Gold Award project to life. Sophia and her twin sister, Grace, are Twin to Twin Transfusion Syndrome survivors. TTTS is a disease of the placenta which creates unequal blood flow and access to nutrients for twins. It is often a fatal disorder. Sophia contacted the founder of the TTTS Foundation, began taking part in educational oppor-

tunities and realized there was a need for care packages to be sent to families dealing with a TTTS diagnosis. Sophia gathered donations to send out educational books, hygiene and notetaking supplies to be used during hospital stays, candles handpainted with the TTTS emblem and, most importantly, hand crocheted baby blankets. Knowing the blankets would be time consuming, Sophia enlisted her FFA Chapter's Crocheting for a Cause group to assist her in making them. She instructed students on crocheting and held meetings after school to put the blankets together. Local Mothers of Twins clubs and Sacred Heart Church crochet club also helped Sophia reach and surpass her goal, making 120 blankets for the care packages.

Grace and Sophia would like to thank the Firelands High School students and staff for helping them achieve their goals of earning their Gold Awards. Special thanks to Mrs. Tawil and Mrs. Finnegan, who helped oversee and guide both projects!

# **FEA Scholarship Award Win**

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
