It is a ceremony that welcomes new members into the FFA Degree program.

FIRST GRADING PERIOD HONOR/MERIT ROLL WINNERS – Firelands High School is proud to announce first grading period Honor and Merit Award winners. The list of students is available on the Firelands High School homepage. Proudly, 231 students earned Honor Roll status. Honor Roll students have achieved a 3.5 GPA or above during the first grading period. Another 90 students earned Merit Roll. Merit Roll students have earned a 3.0 to a 3.49 GPA during the first grading period. A total of 321 students have earned a 3.0 GPA or above during the first nine-weeks of the school year. Congratulations to our Falcons who have earned the Honor or Merit Roll.

Dangers of E-Cigarettes/Juul

As we all know, e-cigarette use among teens and pre-teens is on the rise. One of the most popular e-cigarette devices, called a Juul, is rapidly becoming the go-to device. What you may not know, however, is that all Juul e-cigarettes have a high level of nicotine. **A single Juul pod contains as much nicotine as a pack of (20) regular cigarettes.**

Juul's are shaped like a USB Flash Drive to help teens hide the product. This design element was quickly copied by other manufactures for additional products, including marijuana.

As a reminder, Firelands Local School is proud to be 100% tobacco-free. The use of any tobacco product and/or any type of e-cigarette, is strictly prohibited anywhere on school grounds.

FOOD SERVICE NEWS

Did you know that the Food Service Department is self-supporting?

- We operate solely off the funds brought in from the sale of breakfast and lunches
- We **do not** require any funding from our general funds. All expenses; food, labor and repairs (unless very costly) are paid from the Food Service account
- We are part of the NSLP (National School Lunch & Breakfast Program) We receive Federal reimbursements for every free, reduced and full pay meal that is sold for breakfast as well as lunch
- We also receive .335 for every meal sold, this is called Entitlement dollars. This is used towards the purchase of center of the plate items as well as the Department of Defense program which is how we purchase the many fresh fruits and vegetables we serve
- Breakfast is served daily at all schools. It is available as soon as your child arrives at school. We offer breakfast in the classroom at the elementary. Students may eat in the cafeteria at the High and Middle school. If approved for meal assistance, the same status is for breakfast
- Meal applications can be filled out anytime throughout the school year. If you have a reduction in household income or now receive SNAP or OWF, fill out an application

- Students purchasing meals is what keeps us going and funded

SCHOOL IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS FOR 2018 - 2019

It is now time to update your child's immunizations. If your child will be entering school for the first time, or after attending school elsewhere, please be sure to check that he/she is in compliance with State of Ohio immunization requirements:

Kindergarten – once your child has reached age 4, s/he can complete all required immunizations for diphtheria, pertussis, tetanus (DPT), polio (IPV), hepatitis B (HBV), measles mumps, rubella (MMR), and varicella (chickenpox).

- ◆ **Grades 1-6** – same requirements as for Kindergarten
- ◆ **Grades 7-9** – Grades K-6 requirements plus Tdap (DPT booster) and MCV (meningococcal vaccine)
- ◆ **Grades 10-11** – Grades K-6 requirements plus Tdap (received in 7th grade or later)
- ◆ **Grade 12** – Grades 10-11 requirements plus MCV (must be received at age 16 or older)

Remember to bring your child's immunization records with you when you go to your healthcare provider or clinic. Please send a copy of the immunization record to the school nurse in your child's building, being sure your child's name is on it. Don't forget to keep a copy for yourself!

Lorain County Public Health, 9880 S. Murray Ridge Rd., Elyria, OH 44035 is now offering immunizations (also known as vaccines) Monday through Friday, 8:30 am – 3:30 pm, with evening hours throughout the month. A full vaccine clinic schedule is available at www.LorainCountyHealth.com. Appointments are encouraged, although walk-ins are accepted. Call **440-284-3206** for information or to make an appointment for both children and adults. Bring all immunization records, insurance cards, and cash or check; although some children may be eligible for discounts under the Vaccines for Children (VFC) program. All children under age 18 must be accompanied by a parent or guardian.

Note: Ask your provider about additional vaccines that are recommended for children ages 11-19 such as 2nd dose of varicella (chickenpox), hepatitis A and human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccines.

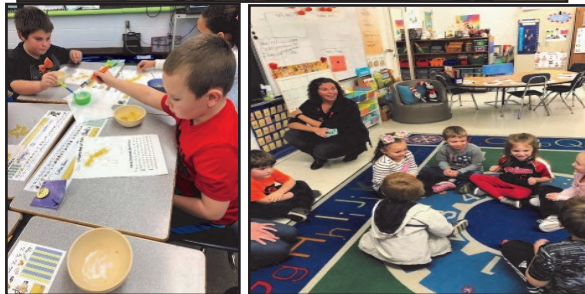
