It was a three-day event, culminating in concerts from Honors Band and Choir students from all over Northeast Ohio. Congratulations also go out to Mr. Wiley and Mrs. Johnson, who are key contributors to this Honors OMEA Event.

NO TARDY PARTY – The Firelands PBIS (Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports) Committee hosted a No-Tardy Party last Friday during FAST. Over 200 of our students were on-time to every class and school day during the first grading period. They celebrated with donuts, provided by Republic Services, and music in the gym at that time. Congratulations to our students who made it on-time every day and every period. Well done. Also, thank you to Republic for also providing pencils during our PSAT day in October.

FFA HARVEST FOR AMERICA FOOD DRIVE - Thank you to everyone that helped to make Harvest for America Food Drive a big success. Firelands FFA is proud to announce the final statistics of the drive at FHS. The top 3 donating classes are: Finnegan (388 donations), Jones (308 donations), Johnson (92 donations) - and Miss Myer's class will also earn a donut party with their 62 donations! The food donation from FHS is estimated to weigh 2,300 lbs. According to Feeding America, the donation from FHS has a wholesale value of \$3,841 or \$7,682 tax deductible value and will provide about 1,920 meals to those in need in our community.

Firelands Elementary's top 3 donating classes are: M. Andorka (161 donations), J. Andorka (104 donations), Menzing (88 donations)! The food donation from FES is estimated to weigh 3,210 lbs. According to Feeding America, the donation from FHS has a wholesale value of \$5,360 or \$10,720 tax deductible value and will provide about 3,000 meals to those in need in our community.

The combined value of the drive is nearly 5,000 meals provided with a value of over \$18,000! Some of the on-date food was used to make the Thanksgiving baskets for the 6th grade Thanksgiving service project. The vast majority of the food will be donated to the foodbank that serves the Firelands School District. All food up-to-one-year-expired will go to the Harvest for Hunger program at Second Harvest food bank. Only 170 lbs of the food was past the use-by date meaning over 5,000 lbs of food will stay in our school district!

Thank you to our FFA members and Mrs. Finnegan, who make-a-difference in the school and Firelands Community every day!!
