JUNIOR SAT DAY – THIS WEDNESDAY, MARCH 4TH – The Ohio Department of Education provides the SAT to all juniors, free of charge. The SAT testing date is this Wednesday, March 4th, with testing beginning at 7:30 am sharp on that date. This is a mandatory test for all juniors, including students attending the LCJVS and CCP full-day students at both Lorain County Community College and BG-Firelands. Student in the other three grades will not have class that day at Firelands High School. Students in grades 9, 10, and 12 should use the day to shadow career interests, or make it a college visit day. The SAT should end that day about noon. They will be excused at that time. Lunch will be provided, but is not required. Students who receive testing accommodations will test that date until approximately 1:15 pm. Please check with your student to see if they will receive special testing accommodations. Students have all been pre-registered. Again, this is a mandatory test for all juniors, regardless of what school they attend (LCCC, FHS, LCJVS). Please contact our school counseling office if you need further details.

There will be no Block Schedule this week. Thursday, March 5th, will be a Tuesday-Friday FAST Schedule day to make-up for missed remediation time for the week. Again, due to the nature of resources required by College Board to administer the SAT, there will be no school for students in the 9th, 10th, and 12th grades on SAT Day, Wednesday, March 4th.

OMEA LARGE GROUP COMPETITION THIS WEEKEND – The Band and Choir, both coming off very successful Solo and Ensemble competitions in the last few weeks, compete in the District Large Group events this weekend, with a chance to advance to OMEA State Competition in the spring. The Choir will perform at Elyria on Friday at 5:20 pm, while the Band performs at Olmsted Falls on Saturday at 10 am. Good luck to all our Choir and Band members as they compete for a chance to advance to state competition.

STATE OF OHIO END OF COURSE EXAMS ARE COMING – The State of Ohio requires all students to achieve certain benchmarks on state testing to be eligible to receive a diploma in Ohio. The first tests are the English-Language Arts tests, which will be on Tuesday, March 31, and Wednesday, April 1st. Testing this year has been reduced to only ELA II Exams, as the Department of Education has eliminated the ELA I testing requirement for the Class of 2023 and beyond. Students who are in 10th grade will test from 7:30 – 10 am on both of these dates, with the other grades having a late arrival on those dates and an abbreviated school schedule. Some 10th and 11th grade students may also have to re-take the ELA I test to achieve their graduation requirements, which differ from the Class of 2023 and beyond. The testing schedule for these two dates is located on page 49 of the student handbook.

CBI SPONSORS CARING CLOSET - Recently some students have put together a Confidential Caring Closet. Mr. Kovi, along with students Mackenzie Mack, Mackenzie Roby, and Jasmin Schuler are sponsoring the Caring Closet. This means that anyone who is in need of house supplies, toiletries, and food are welcome to take what they need. This "closet" is in room 102 at FHS. This is supposed to be a source for students to discreetly grab what they need. We are trying to help out other students, and in order to keep the closet going forward we would appreciate if other students or teachers donate to the caring closet. Tables and designated areas will be set up for students to display/demonstrate their accomplishments, all in the friendly confines of the Firelands High School gymnasium.

SPRING SEASON TO BEGIN – Spring Season practices have begun. Students must have all their forms complete in Final Forms, along with submitting a valid physical to Trainer Joe Menges. Also, all athletes **MUST be passing the equivalent of 5 one-credit classes** at the end of the third grading period. All students must ensure they are currently scheduled for, and passing, at least five classes (not counting PE) at FHS. Students who take College Credit Plus courses must also ensure they will be passing the equivalent of five one-credit HS Classes as of the end of the third grading period. A rule of thumb is this, each college course which is three or more semester hours counts as the equivalent of **TWO** one-credit high school courses. So, as an example, if a student is taking two classes at FHS, they must be passing their high school courses and their two college courses to get to the minimum of five one credit courses for the grading period to be eligible. This is an OHSAA regulation and Firelands BOE policy. For more information, check out the OHSAA Eligibility Guidelines.

Please also note that the Firelands Local Schools require a student to also earn at least a 1.5 GPA in the previous grading period to be eligible for the current grading period.

ONTO THE DISTRICTS – Congratulations to the Firelands Wrestling team as 7 Falcons placed in the top four in the Sectional and advance to next weekend's District tournament at Norwalk on Friday and Saturday. Sectional Champions were Seniors Payton Burgdorf at 132 lbs and Bryce Keown at 145 lbs. Burgdorf captured his third Sectional Championship. Also advancing were Rueben Pina-Lorenzana, who was the Sectional runner-up at 106 lbs. Luke Dempsey (3rd place – 220 lbs), Corey Newark (4th place – 138 lbs), Mason Stanley (4th place – 170 lbs), and Ethan Tester (4th place – 182 lbs). The Falcons finished 4th in the Sectional with 132 points. Wrestling begins at Norwalk at 4 pm on Friday and 9:30 am on Saturday. Good luck to our Falcons who are competing to advance to the Division II State Wrestling Championships March 13-15 at the Jerome Schottenstein Center on the campus of The Ohio State University.

BASKETBALL CLOSES OUT SUCCESSFUL 2019-20 SEASONS— Congratulations to both our Girls and Boys Basketball teams as they bowed out of the State Tournament this past week. The Girls fell to Rocky River, 57-47, last Wednesday at Elyria in the Division II District Semi-Finals. The Girls were a perfect 14-0 in the LC8 to clinch the league title, and finished the year at 20-4. The Boys fell in the Sectional Finals last Friday at East Tech, 46-25, in a game that was close until the end. The Boys finished the season at 16-8, and 9-5, one game out of first place, in the LC8.
