The novel is told from the point of view of 5th grader Melody Brooks, who has cerebral palsy. Her main



Kindergarten Screening

Kindergarten Screening (which was previously scheduled for May 21) is being rescheduled for Monday, August 10 at Firelands Elementary School. Careful consideration will be taken of all guidelines in place by our government and health care agencies in order to keep all children, families, and school staff safe.

For parents who have already registered their children for kindergarten, the time slot previously signed up for will remain the time slot for Kindergarten Screening on Monday, August 10th.

Please confirm your child's Kindergarten Screening appointment by filling out the one-question survey below by Friday, June 5th at https://tinyurl.com/ycgnijbzq or on the Firelands Schools' website.

If you have any remaining documents to finalize your child's registration (2 proofs of residency, immunization records, birth certificate, and copy of the guardian's driver's license), please do so at your earliest convenience. This can be done in the following ways:

- You may upload them to your Final Forms account
- You may place copies of them in the secure lock box outside the Firelands Board of Education (112 N. Lake Street, South Amherst). The lock box is to the left of the entrance doors.
- Documents may also be scanned and emailed to jswiers@firelandsschools.org.

Within a week of the new Kindergarten Screening date, parents will receive information about who their child's kindergarten teacher is and will then be contacted to sign up for a one hour appointment with the child's teacher, which will take place during schools hours on either September 1, 2, or 3. Children will come to school that day for just a one hour appointment. All kindergarten students' first full day of school with their class and bus transportation available is Friday, September 4th.

Safety Town, which had been scheduled for July 6 to 8, is cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

SAMS Project Lead The Way Honored for STEM Excellence



South Amherst Middle
School has been recognized
by the National Organization of
Project Lead The Way (PLTW)
and is deemed a Distinguished
Building for 2019-2020! The
PLTW recognition program is
designed to honor districts and
schools committed to increasing
student access, engagement,
and achievement in their PLTW
programs.

Mr. Chuck Latto, SAMS PLTW Teachers stated, "I am proud to be a part of SAMS's commitment to a premier STEM program such as Project Lead The Way. Research shows that students in middle school are already making decisions about their career paths. This program gives students the opportunity to experience some of the aspects of in demand career fields such as engineering and computer science. Also, regardless of the career path students choose, transportable skills they experience throughout the three PLTW modules will help them be better prepared when facing a highly competitive workforce."

PLTW at SAMS has several different models. Our building provides the PLTW component Gateway to Technology (GTT) and is offered at grade levels:

- 6th graders get seven weeks of Design & Modeling
- 7th graders get seven weeks of Green Architecture
- 8th graders get seven weeks of Automation & Robotics

To earn this distinction, the program had to meet specific criteria including:

- Offered a minimum of one PLTW Gateway unit per grade in the school.
- Had 50 percent of students or more participate in a PLTW Gateway unit.

Of those who participated in a PLTW Gateway unit, 25 percent of students or more participated in two or more PLTW Gateway units during their tenure at your school.

School has strategies and supports in place that support reasonably proportional representation with regard to race, ethnicity, poverty, gender and can support such claims with relevant data.

South Amherst Middle School has earned the privilege of displaying the badge (shown at top) on its website and in the school building.

Below is a sample of a Drag Race Robot designed, built, and programmed out of the VEX robotics equipment by 8th graders in the Automation and Robotics class. They use their understanding of robotic mechanisms and programming to make it drive autonomously for 20 feet in the shortest amount of time.





The dates listed are when we will disperse meals this summer. We will be providing multiple meals per child per pick-up. A family member can pick the meals up if you can't, but they must provide the child/ children's name.

- **June 2- 2:30-5:30
- **June 23 2:30-5:30
- **July 14 2:30-5:30
- **July 28 2:30-5:30

To fill out the google survey, use the link below. You only need to complete the survey if you are new to the grab and go meals. If you complete the survey, it is very important that you pick up on the designated day.

For those that have had a change in income, you may fill out an online meal application prior to June 30th. If your child qualifies for free or reduced meals after filling out the application, that meal status will roll over for the first month of the next school year.

The new and updated application for 2020-2021 school year, will be available after August 1, 2020.

An updated meal application must be filled out every school year. If you fail to update the application each year, your child's meal status will automatically change to denied on September 30th.



Final Forms Streamlines Paperwork

Once again this year Firelands Athletics will be tracking all athletic registrations online through the Final Forms portal. If you have already registered your child via Final Forms in the past then you will simply need to log into your account and select the sports that your son or daughter intend to compete in and you will be added to the roster(s).

If you are new to Final Forms, you can create an account by clicking the link below and following the prompts. You can also find that link on the Firelands Athletic website at www.firelandsathletics.org under the MORE tab.

Either way, your child will also need to log onto their Final forms account to complete their forms for the fall once you have completed or updated your forms. All information and reminders can then be sent from the coaches or from Ty Stillman, Athletic Director, via Final Forms once you register.

Final Forms allows you to complete and sign electronically athletic participation forms for your students. The most exciting news is that Final Forms saves data from season-to-season and year-to-year, meaning that you will never need to enter the same information twice! Final Forms also pre-populates information wherever possible, for each of your students, saving you time.

You will review and verify your information once per school year, to ensure all your data is current and accurate. You will then digitally sign the forms.
