# **FHS Stained Glass Window Mosaic Project in 13th Year**

The Art 3 class at Firelands High School has produced 10 stunning stained glass windows which brings the project total to 215 windows. Beginning in 2010, art teacher Laura Tawil has guided students through this complex process which lasts approximately 10 weeks.

Students used salvaged windows and donated stained glass scraps to build their designs in mosaic. Jenna Selent donated windows and glass cutting tools came from Mrs. Leslie Weber. The Dougan Family donated gloves for the project. Stained glass scraps came from Sheree Ferrato of *Verite Glass* in Oberlin and Mark Mazurak. Each year FFA chapters from all across the nation celebrate National FFA Week. Firelands recognized the event in late March. All students at FHS were encouraged to participate in the celebration that highlighted agricultural education and our young leaders. The week-long tradition began in 1947 when the National FFA Board of Directors designated the week of George Washington's birthday as National FFA Week in recognition of his legacy as an agriculturist and farmer.

Each day of the week at FHS had its own theme including Anything But a Backpack Day; Safety Day; Teacher Appreciation Day; Truck Meet Day; and finally Tractor Day. Our elementary school students even participated in their own FFA Spirit Week!

Our FHS FFA students were extremely creative on Monday! The Anything But a Backpack day challenged students to think of ways to carry their books, without using a backpack. A few rules were in place, but they had a lot of room to come up with fun ideas! Some of the students showed up with rafts, tires, and crockpots.

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# **FHS Construction News: New Outdoor Classroom**

Thanks to a generous donation from The Firelands Endowment Committee, students at the new high school will be able to utilize an outdoor classroom!

This outdoor class area is located just east of the main student entry. It is constructed of brick with a sandstone cap. The finished design compliments the building as well as it highlights the sandstone feature, which pays tribute to South Amherst and Amherst. These towns are both well known due to the quality and quantity of sandstone produced from local quarries. The classroom will offer seating for 30 adults.

Throughout the new high school, students will be able to utilize several creative learning spaces. These areas, also known as extended learning areas (ELAs), are different from a typical classroom setting. ELAs encourage student collaboration due to the unique seating that can assist students in learning in an environment that is proven to be not only more comfortable but also aids in group participation. The new outdoor classroom is an extension of the ELAs and the only one on campus.

Once the physical build is complete, outdoor lighting and landscaping will complete the design. While we look forward to our students utilizing this amazing space, it will also be available to our community outside of normal school hours, thanks to the Firelands Endowment Committee.

Ann Buchs. President of The Firelands Endowment Committee said, "The Firelands Endowment Trustees are excited about being able to provide the outdoor classroom at the new high school. This classroom will enrich the learning process for our students and serve as a gathering point for many years to come. This classroom, grants, and the many scholarships that are awarded each year are only possible through the support of the Firelands community. Many thanks to the teachers, staff and community for their continued support of our endeavors."

## **Agricultural Education Program Expands**

When Firelands opened the doors in 1955, the community was already involved with the National FFA Organization, then known as FFA: Future Farmers of America. Over the years our students have thrived in this agricultural education program. The experience will now be explored by younger students as well. We are extremely pleased to announce that in the fall we will offer an introduction to agricultural education course through our seven-week rotations at the new Firelands Middle School. This hands-on class will be added to all FMS student's schedules.

Each student in grades 6-8 will be scheduled rotations that will be in addition to core curriculum subjects. The special rotations will include: Social and Emotional Learning, Agricultural Science Education, Project Lead the Way, Art and Physical Education. In addition, all 6th graders will now explore Choir.

This new Agricultural Education program at Firelands Middle School will be led by FHS Alumna and teacher, Mrs. Shelby (Balint) McCarty, Firelands High School Class of 2011, Ohio State University Class of 2017. Mrs. McCarty has been teaching agricultural education for five years at Madison Plains High School in London, Ohio.

When asked about the new program, Mrs. McCarty said, "I'm very excited to return to Firelands. My passion for working with students and inspiring them about agricultural education all stems from my experiences at FHS. I truly look forward to giving back to a community that did so much for me as a student. Agricultural education is an amazing program and I'm excited to watch more students have opportunities through this addition to FMS."

The program at FMS will be located in the current agricultural education space at FHS, while the high school program will use the new space.

While FMS is starting with ag ed, the plan is to evolve to a full middle school FFA chapter in the future. FFA, which is part of our program at FHS, is an intracurricular student organization for those interested in agriculture and/or leadership. It is one of the three components of agricultural education which includes fields such as biology, chemistry, farming, veterinary science, animal sciences,



engineering and so much more.

Leadership in the FHS FFA program will remain with Mrs. Finnegan. Our current 4 year program includes the following offerings: Ag, Food and Natural Resources; Animal and Plant Science; Mechanical Principles; Business Management; and Senior Capstone. In addition, College Credit Plus classes for agricultural education on the FHS campus include Animal and Plant Science and Business Management for Agricultural and Environmental Systems. With the addition of Mrs. McCarty, course offerings for high schoolers will be expanded by offering Animal Health and Environmental Science.

Mrs. Finnegan said, "The addition of an Agricultural Educator will give students more opportunities in the classroom with expanded course offerings and will expose more students to opportunities in agriculture while making all of our students in middle school into better consumers. I am also very excited to be able to expand opportunities, especially Career Development Events and leadership opportunities."


#### 5th Grade Math Fun

The 5th graders in Mrs. Watson's class have had a busy week. First, they made 2-D robots and found the total area by counting units and using the formula Area = Length x Width. Next, they did an amazing job cutting out, coloring, and assembling rectangular prisms to make 3-D robots. They found the volume using several strategies including counting by multiples, counting cubes, and using the formula Length x Width x Height. Several of the students shared comments about the project.

Ava Camera said, "I liked making the volume robot. I had fun while learning." Faelynn Reeves said, "I liked designing my robot by folding and creating rectangular prisms." Liam St. Clair said, "I liked the creativity part where you got to make your robot and name him. It was good because you were also learning". Hailey Brown said, "At first I thought it was hard but it turned out to be fun and easy." Toni Dolan said, "It was cool because we got to be creative, but learn at the same time." Lainey Scholl said, "I like doing the area robot because you got to learn, but let your creative side come out."

They are excited to use the knowledge they learned making

the first two robots to create their own free-standing robot using centimeter grid paper. The largest free-standing robot wins a meal from a local fast-food restaurant!




## **Kindergarten Registration**

USDA continues to offer free breakfast and free lunch to all students regardless of need. This extension helps our families/students as well as the Food Service department. Our department gets federal reimbursements for each meal that is sold, so please encourage your child/children to take advantage of this great opportunity.

#### **Instructional fees:**

Instructional fees are only waived if you qualify for free meals based off the information provided on a meal application or if your child was approved through Direct Certification.

on January 31. Be sure to sign and return the letter if you received one so that instructional fees can be waived.






