Construction Continues on Schedule

Last fall construction began on the new High School. Lots of trucks and big earth moving equipment created quite a buzz of excitement. Although they moved a lot of dirt, leveling the ground for the new high school, parking lots and driveways, and installing foundations, there really wasn't that much to see. But our patience paid off this spring when more than just daffodils and daisies began popping up out of the cold winter soil! Even as the last of the snow was still flying and with the building foundations securely anchored in the sandstone our community is known for, the walls of our new school began to grow out of the ground!

Laying up concrete block walls is precise and skilled work. Small errors can cause big problems! The gymnasium walls were the first to be built, rising up straight and true. Soon the other exterior walls followed, up to the level of the second floor, and the Interior partition walls quickly followed. Throughout this part of the project the mechanical and electrical contractors were following along installing the conduit and plumbing pipes that need to be located inside the walls.

When the warmer weather finally arrived, the steel framing which serves as the structure for the gym roof and the second floor could be installed. You may have seen the tall cranes lifting each piece of steel slowly and carefully into place. Around this same time concrete for the first floor was also poured, one section at a time. Wet concrete is heavy and sloppy but must be leveled to

within a 16th of one inch. It's just another example of the many jobs that required skilled and knowledgeable craftsman when building a new school of this size.

You may not have noticed, but on any given day there are 60 to 100 men and women working at the construction site! It takes a lot of planning to ensure they don't get in each other's way and that each piece of the building is built in the proper sequence. In addition to the necessary daily coordination, there are weekly project meetings with the foreman for each trade.

Looking ahead the walls for the second story portions of the building will soon be completed. Then we'll finally have a chance to see the finished shape of the new high school! But the most important next goal is to get the building weather tight from rain and the snow and cold temperatures of winter. This will allow the contractors to work through the winter to complete all the interior work, which includes all the new flooring, ceilings, lighting, furniture and so much more!

In the meantime, the roofing material for the gym is being installed. The windows have already arrived and are being stored, and we may even soon see some of the exterior brick being installed!

We have come a long way since last spring. Although there is still much to be done we are right on target to complete the construction and have the building ready for the start of school in the fall of 2022!

Traffic Alerts!

The traffic signal at the turnpike on Baumhart Road will be placed in a flash condition for a 90-day period to evaluate if the signal can be safely removed per the County Engineer.

A turning lane is being added in front of the new high school. Construction will take approximately four weeks and is expected to start each day after students have all arrived.

The intersection at Baumhart Rd. & Rt. 113 will be closed for 70 days for the installation of a round-about. ODOT is making this change starting after Labor Day.

Food Service Continues USDA Free Meals

Welcome back from our Food Service staff! Our goal is to get back to normal as much as possible. We still ask that students and staff continue to practice safe measures. Social distance, sanitize hands prior to entering the line, and please take the first item you touch.

Our department is selfsupporting as we neither recieve or use tax money. Our source of income includes federal reimbursements for every breakfast and lunch students receive. Please encourage your child/children to utilize our program.

School fees can only be waived if you complete the online meal application (or paper) and are APPROVED for free meals using your income or assistance received as a guide. Checkmark fee waiver. Go to www.payschoolscentral.com for the online application.

Online menus - Go to www. myschoolmenus.com you can filter the menu for allergens, check the nutritionals as well as print the menu. Download the free my school menu app for iPhone and Android. Free meals for all students regardless of need have been extended through the 2021-2022 school year. All students may get a free breakfast and a free lunch every day at no cost. No application needed for the free meals.

<u>Lunch</u> – students must take 3 of the 5 components offered, one component must be a fruit or a vegetable. <u>Breakfast</u> – students must take 3 of the 4 items offered at breakfast, one must be a fruit.

Ala cart items including milk may be purchased using money on the meal account, check or cash. Elementary students – please put money in an envelope or baggie with the students name on it and give money to the homeroom teacher.

Packers bringing lunch from home – you are eligible for free items as well. Add to your packed lunch by selecting 3 items. (For example - milk, fruit, vegetable or main dish, milk and fruit or vegetable)

Elementary Students –
Due to enrollment size, Grades
K-2 will still be served in their
classroom. Grades 3-5 will walk

to the kitchen to get lunch, then take their meal to their classroom. **Breakfast** is picked up in the gym (same as last year) and taken back to their homeroom.

Middle and High School Students will continue to eat in the cafeteria.

Consistency: The Key for Bus Safety

Welcome to the start of the 2021-2022 school year. As we get ready to start the year, we anticipate some road construction that will make it a challenge to get from FHS to SAMS. We expect the intersection at Baumhart and S.R. 113 to be closed from early September to early November for the installation of the roundabout. We also expect Vermilion Road to be shut down to one lane in front of the new school building for a few weeks for the installation of a left hand turning lane. Updates will be on the website as they become

COVID-19 and its variants are still here and we at Firelands will be doing all we can to make sure your children are transported to and from school as safely as possible. We will continue doing regular disinfecting and cleaning of the buses as well as providing hand sanitizers on all of our buses. Our drivers will be encouraging the students to use it as they get on and off the bus. The drivers will be wearing a face covering while driving the bus with students on board.

Parents and guardians will

need to follow all the guidelines as stated on the Firelands
Schools website under the reopening plan! All children
K-12 will be required to wear face coverings while riding the school buses, so please make sure they have them on PROPERLY before getting on the bus. Continue to monitor updates on the school website on safety precautions!

Students that do not ride the bus to school on the first day will need to check with their teacher or the office to find the correct bus number to ride home in the afternoon. Lists will be posted in the halls at SAMS and FHS. Please do not assume that they ride the same bus home as last year as several of the bus numbers have changed. If the bus that arrives at your house is different than what is published, the driver will instruct the students of the proper number.

Please remember these times are approximate and may vary especially the first week or two of school, and with a few road detours and other construction, the pick-up and drop off times may change after the first week.

We ask that you have your child ready ahead of time,

and wait for the bus in a safe location, approximately 10 feet from the road. Remember to social distance and be courteous to others at bus stops. There will continue to be an emphasis on designated place of safety both before and after school. Even students on the right hand side need to stay back away from the edge of the road and wait until the bus driver signals them before students approach the bus. For those who need to cross the road, please wait for the drivers hand signal before crossing and check traffic on your own.

Post cards or emails will be sent out approximately one week before school with bus numbers and times to alleviate phone calls. All of the information listed here, and the morning routes will be available on the Firelands website: http://www.firelandsschools.org, under the Central Office tab / Transportation along with the variance form procedure and a printable variance form for your convenience.

Please do not assume that your child will ride the same bus home as last year as some of the bus numbers have changed.

If your child's school begins before August 31, 2021 and you will need transportation, you will need to call Mr. Sayler at 965-4105 to make arrangements.

Changes to pick-up and drop-off locations:

As the school year approaches, many of you will be making daycare arrangements for your children. Please keep the following procedure in mind for the safety of the children. Remember, pick-up and dropoff locations at the child's home address is always best, but we realize it is not always possible. When a change for pick-up or drop-off is necessary, we are asking you to adhere to the following procedure.

IMPORTANT: Even though there is a place on Final Forms to enter this route change information, you MUST have the proper forms filled out each year! Variance forms are available at the elementary and middle school offices, and can also be printed from our school website under the forms and links tab, K-12 Bus Variance Forms. These forms are designed for permanent or steady route changes.

WITH THE SAFETY OF YOUR CHILD IN MIND, VARIABLE AND ALTERNATING DAYS WILL NOT BE ALLOWED.

Please have variance forms completed and turned into the school or bus garage FIVE DAYS prior to the effective dates, so everyone involved may have proper notice of the change. We ask that the change be in effect for the entire year. The change must be in effect through an existing route.

YOU MUST FILL OUT A NEW FORM EACH SCHOOL YEAR.

With the safety of your child in mind, school transportation must remain consistent. Variable and alternating days will not be allowed. However, we realize

If this one time change is approved, parents need to send a note with the child to be given to the bus driver upon boarding. If Mr. Sayler does not have space available on a particular bus route or if a child does not bring a note, the one-time temporary route change will be refused out of safety concerns.






