Roping Her Way to Nationals

FHS Student Addison Webb Represents Ohio



Last spring Addison Webb, then an 8th grader at SAMS, qualified in the top 4 in the State of Ohio at the Ohio Junior High School Rodeo in Breakaway Roping and Team Roping. In June, she traveled to Perry, Georgia to compete at the National Junior High Finals Rodeo against the top 4 from each state and also 3 countries.

In the second round of Breakaway Roping, Addison ended up 24th out of 144 kids. She caught her calf with a 3.84 second time! She made it to the final round in team roping Jackpot with a 7.3 second run.

Addison had a great experience being on the big stage with the top 4 kids from

all 50 states and the top kids from Mexico and Canada. She competed with the best of the best and finished off her week strong.

This fall, Addison will start her high school rodeo series with the hopes of making it to nationals again. She competes yearround in Breakaway Roping, Team Roping, Goat Tying, Barrel Racing and Pole Bending with her two horses, Toto and Breeze. She will be in Fort Worth, Texas in March for the Junior Patriot Rodeo.

Addison plans to attend college after high school where she can compete on their college rodeo team.

Bus Safety & News: Consistency is Key!

Welcome to the start of the 2022-2023 school year. As we get ready to start the year, we anticipate some road construction to continue on Vermilion Road between Middle and North Ridge roads. Updates will be on the website as they become available.

Students that do not ride the bus to school on the first day will need to check with their teacher or the office to find the correct bus number to ride home in the afternoon. Lists will be posted in the halls at FMS and FHS. Please do not assume that they ride the same bus home as last year as bus numbers may have changed. If the bus that arrives at your house is different than what is published, the driver will instruct the students of the proper number.

Please remember these times are approximate and may vary especially the first week or two of school, and the pick-up and drop off times may change after the first week. We ask that you have your child ready ahead of time, and wait for the bus in a safe location, approximately 10 feet from the road. Remember to be courteous to others at bus stops.

There will continue to be an emphasis on designated stops for safety both before and after school. Even students on the right hand side need to stay back away from the edge of the road and wait until the bus driver signals them before students approach the bus. For those who need to cross the road, please wait for the drivers hand signal before crossing and check traffic on your own.

Emails will be sent out approximately one week before school with bus numbers and times to alleviate phone calls. All of the information listed here, and the morning routes, will be available on the Firelands website: http://www.firelandsschools.org, under the Central Office tab, Transportation along with the variance form procedure and a printable variance form for your convenience.

If your child's school begins before September 6, 2022 and you will need transportation, you will need to call Mr. Sayler at 965-4105 to make arrangements.

Changes to pick-up and drop-off locations: As the school year approaches, many of you will be making daycare arrangements for your children. Please keep the following procedure in mind for the safety

of the children. Remember, pick-up and drop-off locations at the child's home address is always best, but we realize it is not always possible. When a change for pick-up or drop-off is necessary, we are asking you to adhere to the following procedure.

IMPORTANT: There is a link on Final Forms for the variance form. You MUST have the proper forms filled out each year! Variance forms are available at the elementary and middle school offices, and can also be printed from our school website under the forms and links tab, K-12 Bus Variance Forms. These forms are designed for permanent or steady route changes.

Please have variance forms completed and turned into the school or bus garage FIVE DAYS prior to the effective dates, so everyone involved may have proper notice of the change. We ask that the change be in effect for the entire year. The change must be in effect through an existing route. YOU MUST FILL OUT A NEW FORM EACH SCHOOL YEAR.

With the safety of your child in mind, school transportation must remain consistent. Variable and alternating days will not be allowed. However, we realize that emergencies do occur.

In the event of an emergency, parents will need to call Mr. Sayler at 440-965-4105 to see if a possible alternate bus route is available 24 hours in advance. If this one time change is approved, parents need to send a note with the child to be given to the bus driver upon boarding. If Mr. Sayler does not have space available on a particular bus route or if a child does not bring a note, the one-time temporary route change will be refused out of safety concerns.

CONSISTENCY IS THE KEY!

Our Drivers do an awesome job keeping our students safe! They will continue to provide the safest form of transportation to and from school. We are all looking forward to another safe school year.

REMEMBER it has been a long time since school buses have been stopping on the

This option officially came to a close on June 30, 2022. The 2022-23 school year will follow the procedures of previous non-pandemic years, and households will need to apply for free and reduced lunches.

Notably, it takes approximately 30 days to process these applications. For families who applied during the 2021-22 school year, the first 30 days of lunches will be covered while the application for the new school year is processed.

Firelands Food Service Celebrates New Cafeteria & Kitchen

The universal free meal program has ended. This program has helped many families the last two years and we are so grateful for it. Please be prepared to load money on your student's account so they can receive a meal.

Meal prices

Breakfast: \$1.75 Breakfast (reduced) .30 Lunch, FES: \$2.90 Lunch, FES (reduced): .40 Lunch, FHS & FMS: \$3.20 Lunch, FHS & FMS (reduced): .40

Lunch: Must take 3 of 5 components offered, must take a ½ c. fruit or vegetable. (Components: meat, grain, fruit, vegetable & milk.)

Breakfast: Must take 3 of 4 items offered, one must be ½ c. fruit or juice. (Items: grain and or meat, fruit or juice & milk.)

New Cafeteria

Our 6-12 graders will transition to our new cafeteria. This is very exciting! The cafeteria and kitchen are absolutely amazing. The new facility will have 5 stations, including Main, Grille, Deli, Everything Fresh (salads & yogurt parfaits), and a Pizzeria. Any student can choose from their station of choice, allowing them to build a reimbursable meal at any station. All students -- free, reduced and full pay -can utilize the stations and build a meal. The same meals will be offered to both middle and high school students. The stations will be open gradually to ease the transition.

Ala cart items

Students must have money on their account to purchase smart snack ala cart items. The

allowable beverage items vary for middle school students. These items will be placed in an open air cooler specifically for middle school and another for high school students.

Elementary Students

FES Students will continue to eat in their classrooms. Grades 1-5 will come to the kitchen to pick up their lunch tray to take back to the classroom.

Meal assistance application

PLEASE fill out a meal application even if you are unsure if your child/children will qualify. We want to make sure all our students are able to get a free or reduced price meal if eligible. You can complete an application online at www.payschoolscentral.com. Paper applications will be available in each school office or at the board office. Online applications are preferred.

Direct Certification/Free Meals

Direct Certification was completed in July and will be run every month to find new students that may qualify. This process will automatically approve students for free meals if they qualify. *IF* you receive a letter stating your child/children were approved, **YOU MUST** sign and return the letter which will allow instructional school fees to be waived. I run the <u>Direct Certification several times</u> throughout the school year to catch any students that may qualify after the initial run.

Self-supporting

Our Food Service department does not use any tax dollars/ general funds to run our department. We are funded by federal dollars which we get from each meal that is sold. Your










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
