Kindergarten Registration Starts March 2nd

Parents living in the Firelands school district with children who will be five years old by August 1, 2022 are eligible to register their child for 2022-2023 kindergarten starting on March 2, 2022. Online registration can even be completed on your phone, without downloading an app. (Follow the link at the end of this article.) Accepted open enrollment students for kindergarten can also be registered at this time.

Kindergarten registration involves completing all of the online forms in the Final Forms portal and providing all required documents. Documents required for registration are as follows:

- · your child's birth certificate
- · 2 proofs of residency
- · parent/guardian photo ID
- · shot records
- · custody papers (if they apply)

Residency documents must be recent and must show current address. Examples include: recent utility bill (gas, electric or water), lease, mortgage statement, recent pay stub, home or rental insurance statement.

Kindergarten screening is a separate event that will take place on May 18, 2022, but your time slot must be set up during the registration process in March. Students cannot be screened until registration is complete.

Safety Town is scheduled for July 11, 12 or 13. A sign up form is on the Student Registration page. Students cannot participate until registration is complete.

The Board of Education office will be open on March 2nd and March 3rd to assist anyone who needs help with forms and documents. If you need access to a computer, we always have Chromebooks available. Staff from Firelands Elementary School will also be on hand to answer questions. The times are as follows:

- Wednesday, March 2nd from 3:30 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.
- Thursday, March 3rd from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.

6th graders are planning on going to Beulah Beach May 23-25. Information will come out in the future for parents regarding this trip.


7th grade is also planning on taking a trip. They will be going to the Henry Ford Museum in Michigan on May 6th.




National Pizza Day

School Counseling Week

Did you know that the week of February 7 was National School Counseling Week? FES is beyond lucky to have two school counselors in our building. Mrs. Valerie Schuster and Ms. Christian Conner are key staff members at FES. They work diligently to do all that they can to support students and staff in a variety of ways. Each day of National School Counseling Week, Mrs. Schuster and Ms. Conner came up with a theme and shared information with students and staff. This included:

meet your school counselors; learn about the role of a school counselor; why not "guidance counselor"; better together; and take a positive message.

This year they are piloting Second Step Elementary in kindergarten and fifth grade classes. Each grade level receives 20 lessons, taught by our counselors, from this research-based social-emotional learning program. Second Step skills and concepts are designed to help children both in and out of school. This program helps students acquire the skills, knowledge, and mindset needed to persevere through challenges, set and achieve goals, handle strong emotions, better understand and connect with others, and resolve interpersonal conflicts. In addition, the program helps develop students' executive-function skills and promotes a growth mindset (the belief that intelligence and abilities can be developed). Together these skills and mindsets contribute to positive classroom and school climates that serve as the foundation for academic and social success. If you see Mrs. Schuster or Ms. Conner, take the time to learn more about all that they do for our Falcons, their families and our community!

Fabulous Falcon Award

One of the awards that FES students have the opportunity to earn is the Fabulous Falcon



Award. This award is given three times a school year and is focused on recognizing students who exhibit characteristics that align with our PBIS expectations. Those characteristics have been defined as SOAR - reminding our students that they are ready to "soar." S stands for safety, O stands for organization, A stands for achieving goals, and R stands for respectful. These students are selected by their teachers, who then are able to write the nomination and reasoning for earning the award. Mrs. Choe, Mrs. Groboske, Ms. Conner and Mrs. Schuster then recognize these students at a small ceremony with family members in attendance. Students are given a certificate and a yard sign to display to show that they are a "Fabulous Falcon." It is truly a highlight of the school year.


Winter Music Concerts

Another STEM Grant Awarded to Firelands

The team of Latto/Roemer has received another STEM grant on behalf of Firelands Local Schools!

Firelands Local Schools will be awarded \$5,000 to expand STEM learning projects through Ohio STEM Learning Network Classroom Grant Program, funded by Battelle. The grants will create sustainable, STEM learning projects to benefit students for years to come.

Students at Firelands High School will use the engineering design process to design, build and program autonomous and driver controlled robots for their proposed client. According to FLSD Director of Educational Services, Mrs. Lori Roemer, "the district is always looking for opportunities to expand

educational opportunities for our students. Expanding our STEM offerings will provide another pathway to promote knowledge and skills that are in high demand." Using VEX V5 robotics kits and the VEX Stem Lab Curriculum, students will work in teams applying science concepts to build various robotic mechanisms. For example, speed and torque will be calculated based on gear and sprocket ratios. Teams will apply their understanding of block, python, and text coding to create algorithms that will program their robots to perform their required tasks. The kits are durable and will be reused from one semester class to the next. Students will collaborate, communicate, and think critically to invent new robot

designs to increase the efficiency Latto and Roemer. The District of their robot performance on a variety of challenges. As a result of this course, students will acquire real-world teamwork, design, programming, and problem-solving skills that can be transferred to future careers.

According to STEM teacher Mr. Chuck Latto, "This grant will provide an additional opportunity for students at Firelands to experience robot design and programming at the next level. The VEX V5 equipment is state of the art robotics technology that will challenge students to think creatively while using logic and reason to solve complex problems."

The Automation & Robotics grant was submitted in late 2021 thanks to the joint effort of



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

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
