Kindergarten Registration Starts March 1st

Fall 2023 kindergarten registration begins March 1st for district residents. Families can prepare for this process by having ready the following documents.

- 1. Parent or guardian identification cards
- 2. Birth certificate of kindergarten student
- 3. Up to date immunization list for kindergarten student
- 4. Two proof of residency documents, such as utility bills

Other documents that may be needed include any custody papers, special needs documentation, or residency affidavits for renters. Starting March 1st, district families can begin online registration using Final Forms. This is an online portal where all registration forms are completed and documents are uploaded.

- Step 1, go to www.firelands-oh/finalforms.com.
- Step 2, create or log into your parent account.
- Step 3, create a new student account for your kindergartner.
- Step 4, upload documents when prompted.

Step 5, complete each form by typing your name at the bottom and hitting "submit."

The board office will be open to assist with registration on March 1st from 8:00-3:00 and March 2nd from 3:30-7:00. You can find all of these instructions and more on our website at www.firelandsschools. org and click "Enroll Now."

THE FIBELANDS EXPRESS **Traffic Concerns** Alladin Tickets **Raised to ODOT**

When the new school was built, much care went into the campus design to try to elevate traffic concerns. A turning lane was installed on Vermilion Road and a long driveway was included as part of the school design at FHS to keep the majority of traffic out of the main roads. FES drop off and pick up were adjusted in order to create the best possible solution.

In 1998. Firelands began working on a permanent solution by requesting a traffic signal on the corner of State Route 113 and Vermilion Road. The district had a formal resolution created (99-263) on November 15, 1999, acknowledging the immediate need for a light to be installed.

Prior to construction of the high school, a new traffic study was completed and unfortunately prior, during and presently ODOT refuses to support our concern.

We have worked with and fought against every level of government and the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) since that date for the safety of our students, staff, and community members. The district has also reached out to Representative Miller for his support, which was given, but also not recognized by ODOT.

ODOT continues to tell us that traffic issues in the morning and afternoon do not qualify for their attention. In order to have a light installed they would have to see traffic issues all hours of the day.

As evident by the installation of the round-a-bout at Baumhardt Road and State Route 113 and the removal of the stop light at State Route 60 and State Route 113, ODOT is removing stop lights throughout

the state. Our request goes against their current removal of traffic signals, no matter the importance, which the district has offered to fund completely.

At this time, we feel that our community could potentially help us establish an awareness for this issue. Would you help support our efforts by contacting our local government officials and ODOT and let them know of your concerns? You can find contact information for Ms. Julie Cichello below. March 1st

- · Registration through Final Forms opens for kindergarten. Process can be completed online. This includes BOTH district residents and open enrollment applicants.
- Registration for accepted open enrollment students, Grades 1-12, will begin through Final Forms.

March 1st & 2nd

The Board Office in South Amherst is open and staffed to assist kindergarten parents if needed. Times are 8:00-3:00 on March 1st, and 3:30-7:00 on March 2nd.

April 3rd

Status notifications for kindergarten open enrollment applications are sent from the Superintendent's Office.

May 17th

Kindergarten Screening at FES. (Required). Your screening time slot will be scheduled during March registration.

JVS Students Weld Lockers for Amherst Fire Department

Lorain County JVS Welding and Fabrication students accepted the challenge to make specialized storage lockers for the Amherst Fire Department.

"The Amherst Fire Department is in the process of switching from a basic life support provider (BLS) to an advanced life support provider (ALS)," shared Assistant Fire Chief, Brandon Dimacchia. "One part of the process of becoming an ALS provider is being able to carry life-support drugs, which are also narcotics, and these must be locked by State standards. Lockers like these are used in ambulances and some fire trucks."

Welding and Fabrication senior, Max Kennedy from Firelands, explained the process of getting the lockers built. "It was a little bit more difficult than I thought it would be because it looks just like a rectangle with a door, but when you get into the project you have to make sure that the hole for the keypad is cut out right, and when you're making two, you have to make sure they look the same."

Dimacchia said the lockers are exactly what they were looking for. "We needed something with a code and latch, it needed to be solid, and can't be broken into. These look great." Making something that will be used in the community made Kennedy feel good about his work. "We build a lot of things in our lab, but it is stuff for here, so to have something we've made be used out in the real world is cool."
