# FHS Construction Update Inside: Architectural Drawing & Site Plan

While many aspects of our daily lives were and continue to be impacted by COVID-19, I am happy to share that work on our new high school was able to continue. Our construction team, led by BSHM Architects, Greenspace Construction, our construction manager at risk, Osborn Engineering, our commissioning agent, owners representatives from Ennis Britton Consulting and the Ohio Facilities Construction Commission have worked diligently these past months to ensure our building project remains on schedule.

In December, January and February meetings were held for students, staff and community to gather their input regarding the construction plans for the new high school. These educational visioning meetings formed the basis of the criteria used to define the characteristics of the new building. Through the input of various

### District Places No New Tax Levy on November Ballot

On June 22, the Firelands Board of Education voted unanimously to consolidate our two existing emergency levies that expire in 2021 into one substitute levy. The 5.98 mil, 10 year substitute levy will be on the November 3rd ballot. Consolidating our two existing emergency levies into one substitute levy will not increase YOUR taxes, but it will allow Firelands Local School District to benefit from the growth of new construction in our community. Approval of this levy is critical to ensuring our district provides high quality programs in our academic offerings, the arts and athletics.

The first year of the Substitute Levy will generate the exact amount of revenue as the two Emergency Levies that it is replacing. After that, the only increase in revenue the district will see will be from new construction that will also be taxed at the same rate.



stakeholders, these meetings assured that the communities and District's goals were aligned.

The renderings to the left show both a preliminary exterior view of the new high school and site plan. The new masonry brick building includes changes in brick coloring that will provide both depth and balance and our design team is studying the possible integration of sandstone into the design. Large windows allowing for natural light in classrooms, entry points and the cafeteria, which will connect to the existing high school, are included throughout the building.

At over 106,000 sq feet, our new high school remains the same size as was approved by our community in November of 2018. Our new building includes:

- Teaching spaces for all core academic disciplines, special education, the arts, vocational-agriculture, technology and physical education including two gyms, of which one will include a stage with appropriate lighting and sound for performances
- ★ Collaboration areas for students and staff to utilize as additional spaces for teaching and learning
- As the new building will serve as the main entrance for the new high school and existing high school (future middle school), offices for both the high school and middle school are included
- ★ Kitchen/cafeteria that will be utilized by all students in grades 6-12
- Mechanical equipment rooms that include efficient air handlers, boilers, and air conditioning units. Our commissioning agent continues to review the mechanical electrical, and plumbing systems for energy efficiency, functionality and cost to best

serve the building and the district's needs.

Understanding that traffic is already a concern on Vermilion Road, our design team worked diligently to develop a solution. Ample visitor parking is included in the front of the building for easy access, while staff, student and parent drop areas are behind the building, including a separate area for our busses.

Parking and staging areas behind the building will be sized to accommodate the needs of the district during the day as well as various athletic events and community activities that will occur in the evenings.

Looking ahead, site preparation is slated to begin this fall with construction continuing through the spring of 2022 and we are optimistic that the building will be ready for the 2022-2023 school year.

In the near-term, there will be some adjustments that will be needed for traffic flow as the driveway north of the existing building will no longer be able to accommodate bus or car traffic. Details on these changes will be shared in August, prior to the start of the new school year.

# Planning for the 2020-2021 School Year

Thank you to the 600 parents that completed our surveys in May for the 2019-2020 school year and our 2020-2021 planning survey.

At the time of completion, 65% of those who responded were comfortable in returning to school, while 35% indicated they were not yet ready to have their children return to school and would prefer an online option. With this information and guidelines from the Ohio

Department of Health and the Ohio Department of Education regarding the opening of school for the 2020-2021 school year, district staff are meeting to finalize plans for Firelands.

Parents will be receiving an email, including an electronic survey asking for their commitment for the upcoming school year in July. In addition, information will be posted to our website regarding our plans for the upcoming school year.

#### **Maver Moves On, Keener Named FHS Principal** development and technology

After six years as Principal at Firelands High School, Mr. Bob Maver is leaving to be the Director of Human Resources with Westlake City Schools. Mr. Maver joined Firelands in 2014 after being the Assistant Principal at Midview High School. 

Safety Town, which had been scheduled for July 6-8, is cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.


#### **Parent Teacher Group**

## School Immunization/Vaccine Requirements for 2020-2021

Attention: If your child will be entering 12<sup>th</sup> grade, 7<sup>th</sup> grade or any grade for the first time -- it is now time to update immunizations. If entering school for the first time, or after attending school elsewhere, please be sure to check that your child is in compliance with State of Ohio immunization requirements:

Kindergarten: Once your child has reached age 4, she or he can complete all required immunizations for diphtheria, pertussis, tetanus (DPT), polio (IPV), hepatitis B (HBV), measles mumps, rubella (MMR), and varicella (chickenpox).

If possible, have them done and bring a copy of the record to Kindergarten screening.

**Grades 1-6:** the requirements are the same as for Kindergarten

Grades 7-11: Grades K-6 requirements plus Tdap (DPT booster) and MCV4 (meningococcal conjugate vaccine)

**Grade 12:** Grade 7-11 requirements **plus** MCV4 (must be received at age 16 or older)

Remember to bring your child's immunization records with you when you go to your healthcare provider or clinic. Please send a copy of the immunization record to the

school nurse in your child's building, being sure your child's name is on it. <u>Don't forget to keep a copy for yourself!</u>

Anyone can obtain immunizations at Lorain County Public Health, 9880 S. Murray Ridge Road, Elyria, OH 44035. A full vaccine clinic schedule is available at <a href="https://www.loraincountyhealth.com/vaccines">https://www.loraincountyhealth.com/vaccines</a>.

Appointments are always encouraged, although walkins are accepted. For more information or to make appointments for both children and adults, you can call (440)284-3206. Bring all

immunization records, insurance cards, and cash or check; some children may be eligible for discounts under the Vaccines for Children (VFC) program. All children under age 18 must be accompanied by a parent or guardian.

**Note:** Ask your provider about additional vaccines that are recommended for children ages 11-19 such as 2<sup>nd</sup> dose of varicella (chickenpox), hepatitis A and human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccines.

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






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
