

The LC8 championship title goes to both Firelands middle school girls and boys track teams this year! Both dominated the meet, scoring in every event. Every one of the athletes contributed to the win and many set new personal records.

New school records were set by Jimmy Berry in the 100 and 200 meter hurdles and Ayden Fortner in the 200 meter dash. The 4 x 400 relay team of Dane Vanderpool, Carter Jones, Kase Rogers and Zack Zimmerman also set a new school record, as did the 4 x 800 relay team of Tanner Tubbs, Kase Rogers, Carter Jones and Max Dougan. The 4 x 200 Relay Team of D'Mari Campbell, Zack Zimmerman, Finn Pruit and Alex Duke set a school record as well.

Audrey Smith set a new school record in the 100 meter dash, as did the 4 x 800 relay team of Dilynn Copley, Hazel Littleton, Gianna Camera, and Peyton West. The 4 x 400 relay team of Audrey Smith, Jordyn Copley, Hazel Littleton, and Audrey Smith added another school record to bring the total to 9 new school records for SAMS!

On May 14<sup>th</sup> the athletes who qualified went to the OHSAA Middle School Track Meet. They were the first from Firelands to ever participate in this state event! #### **Mock Trial Experience**

Students in Mrs. Dempsey's 5th grade gifted ELA class participated in a mock trial experience, hosted by the Educational Service Center of Lorain County Gifted

Department, on Tuesday, May 10th. The event was held virtually on Zoom, with judges from the Lorain County Justice Center presiding over the trials. Gifted classes in grades 5 through 8 from several local school districts participated in this valuable learning opportunity.

Students worked hard to learn courtroom terminology, the parts of a trial, how to question a witness through both direct and cross examination, discovering and supporting facts and evidence, public speaking, and more! Magistrate Adam Bryda of the Lorain County Prosecutor's Office visited FES in April and worked closely with students to prepare for their trial.

In the virtual courtroom, students played their roles as defense attorneys and witnesses in a criminal trial that involved arson charges. The defense attorneys confidently questioned witnesses on both direct and cross examination, which demanded listening closely for details, critical thinking, and their ability to think on their feet. The bailiff showed his leadership skills as he took charge of the process and also swore in each witness.

What a rewarding way to learn about our judicial system and also about future career possibilities!

#### Fun Run Fundraiser

The FES PTG and principals partnered with Boosterthon to conduct a fundraiser event that was a wonderful event for our students. A Fun Run was held on Friday, May 13 for our students. All were able to participate and were outside for approximately



#### **Young Authors Conference**



#### 3rd Grade Tacos vs. Burgers


Third graders conducted serious research on hamburgers and tacos by learning everything from their historic origins, toppings, pricing and local availabilty. They used the information to build a food truck





#### **USDA Ends Free Meals for All**

The federal universal free meal program will end on June 1, 2022. This program has helped many families the last two years and we are so grateful for it. Please be prepared for lunch fees for next year.

#### Meal assistance application

PLEASE fill out a meal application even if you are unsure if your child/children will qualify. We want to make sure all our students are able to get a free or reduced price meal, if eligible. After July 1, you can complete an application online at <a href="https://www.payschoolscentral.com">www.payschoolscentral.com</a>. Paper applications will be available in each school office or at the board office. Online applications are preferred.

#### **Direct Certification/Free Meals**

FLSD will run the Direct Certification a few weeks before school starts. This process will automatically approve students for free meals if they qualify. If you receive a letter stating your child/children were approved, YOU MUST sign and return the letter which will allow instructional school fees to be waived. FLSD will run the Direct Certification several times throughout the school year to catch any students that may qualify after the initial run.

#### **Self-Supporting**

Our FLSD Food Service department does not use any tax dollars or general funds to operate the department. The department is funded by federal dollars which are received from each meal that is sold. Your children can get a breakfast and lunch each day for free, reduced or the cost of the meal for those that are full pay.

#### **Senior Meal Accounts**

Remaining funds on accounts can be moved to a siblings account, or refunded by contacting Mrs. Judy Baumann. It can also be donated to our emergency fund to help others with meals. If Mrs. Judy Baumann is not contacted about a refund, the remaining balance will transfer to the emergency fund

#### 2022-2023 New Cafeteria

6th through 12th graders will transition to the new cafeteria. This is very exciting! The cafeteria and kitchen are absolutely amazing. The new facility will have stations the students can choose from allowing them to build a reimbursable meal from their choice of station. The same meals will be offered to both middle and high school students. Smart snack approved, a la carte items will be available as well. The allowable beverage items vary for middle school students. These items will be placed in an open air cooler specifically for middle school and another for high school students.












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
