Construction News and Bidding Information

We are getting closer to the new Firelands High School!

The next bid package, GMP2 (guaranteed maximum price) is the concrete and steel package. That package will be out this month with bids due in December. Next, the building package GMP3 will be out in January with bids due later in the month.

The fall of 2021 will bring the furniture and technology packages. Please see the bidding information on page 4.

If you drive past the building site you might notice new pavement on the north side of the current high school. This is to ensure that equipment and construction workers have a place to park during the coming muddy winter and spring months.



Record-Setting Falcons Make History



The Falcons ended their season with a 42-27 victory over long time rival, Vermilion Sailors. After a 7-2 season, which included winning two playoff games, the team took home the cherished Stillman Cup.

The Stillman Cup is named after athletic directors and brothers, Ty Stillman and Andy Stillman.

This varsity squad is the first Firelands team to win in a playoff game, starting with a 59-20 win



over Upper Sandusky in October. Teams in 2011 and 2015 made it to the playoffs, but did not secure a win. This year's second playoff game with Napoleon ended in a close 21-20 score and left the Falcons with a 7-1 season record prior to losing to Shelby. With the win over Vermilion, the team ends with an 8-2 record.

Food Service News

Student I.D. Cards:

Once pictures are taken, all students will receive a hard copy student I.D. card with a barcode on it. This card will be used for different things, including scanning into the meal program point of sale system for high and middle school students. We currently use an orbital scanner to scan the temporary cards students received at the start of the year. Students should have this card with them when they come to the register. This card is used to purchase ala cart items as well. Students are not being charged for their meals at this time, this is simply for tracking meals.

Student fee waivers / updated meal application for 20-21: We have had approximately 165 students

approximately 165 students previously qualify for free meals, which have not filled out the meal assistance application for this school year. Even though all students are receiving free meals, you <u>MUST</u> complete a meal application, if you feel you would qualify for free meals, in order to have the school fees

waived. Also, by completing a meal application now, if your child would qualify, this meal status will roll over for the first month of the next school year.

the ground, they quickly found sandstone not very far below the surface. In fact, it covers a large portion of the site! The good news is that this was expected, and the contractors are prepared to deal with the stone. In fact, some of it is being ground up and used in the new construction, ensuring that our new high school, just like our community, has a firm foundation!

Lorain County and in particular the townships that make up our school community has long been known for having vast quantities of sandstone. The first settlers to this area used the stone to build grist and sawmills. Later, large scale sandstone quarrying brought the early railroad to our area fueling growth and also increasing the population. Although today the demand for sandstone has reduced dramatically, it is still quarried. Its impact on our community remains.


Outdoor Experiment


Parent Teacher Group


Ten FHS Artists Exhibit in 2020 County HS Show


