## **Food Service Reminders**

FREE MEALS: USDA did not renew the waiver for students to receive free meals. It is very important that you complete a meal application if you feel your children will qualify. The end of the free meals was not a decision that Firelands made, this comes from USDA.

### **MEAL APPLICATIONS:**

Now is the time to get your meal application submitted so your child can get uninterrupted meals. Go to <a href="https://www.payschoolscentral.com">www.payschoolscentral.com</a> If you don't have an account, you will need to register first, then follow the directions.

DIRECT CERTIFICATION: If you received a letter stating your children qualified for free meals, the letter must be signed and returned in order to have the fees waived.

### **NEGATIVE MEAL**

ACCOUNTS: Due to the end of the free meals, we have many accounts that have gone into the negative. Please act ASAP and complete an application. All negative accounts must be paid in full.

FES STUDENTS: Please help your children to learn their 6 digit pin # (same as PowerSchool number) this will help to get students through the breakfast and lunch lines faster.

FHS/FMS: All students regardless of need are eligible to go to any station. Students can take a main dish, 2 fruits, 2 vegetables and a milk. They only need to take 3 of the 5 components offered.

BREAKFAST: We serve breakfast at all schools. Students at FES come to the kitchen directly off the bus. FHS/FMS serve breakfast from 7-9 allowing late arrivals a second chance at getting breakfast.

This area, "John's Safe Space" (JSP) was created for students who are struggling. We

understand that our students balance a tremendous workload, coupled with pandemic fallout. At any given time they manage academics, athletics, mental health issues, work responsibilities

and sometimes a difficult social and home life. We are proud to add this opportunity as another available resource for our students.

The JSP room is a safe environment where students can calmly decompress and regain focus. The room features


a couch, low lighting, calming colors, a fish tank, sensory activities and an overall positive atmosphere.

Business meetings are not scheduled during the months of December and July. We look



## **Public Release: Benefits Available to Eligible Families**

### Firelands Local Schools

announced its 2022-2023 program year policy for meal assistance for students unable to pay the full price of meals or milk served under the National School Lunch and School Breakfast, After School Care Snack or Special Milk Programs. Each school office and the central office has a copy of the policy, which may be reviewed by any interested party.

The Federal Income Eligibility
Guidelines will be used to
determine eligibility. Children from
families whose annual income is at
or below the federal guidelines are
eligible for free and reduced-price
meals or free milk if the school
participates in the Special Milk
Program.

Application forms are distributed to all homes in a letter to parents or guardians. To apply for free and reducedprice benefits, households should complete an application and return it to the school. Additional copies are available at the principal's office in each school. A complete application is required. Households which currently receive Special Nutrition **Assistance Program Benefits** (SNAP, formally known as food stamps) or Ohio Works First (OWF) funds for a child must provide the child's name, the SNAP or OWF case number and signature of an adult household member on the application.

Households that do not receive SNAP or OWF funds must provide the names of all household members, the last four digits of the Social Security Number of the adult signing the application or state "none" if the adult does not have a Social Security Number, the amount and source of income received by each household member (state the monthly income) and the signature of an adult household member. If any of this information is missing. the school cannot process the application.

### FREE HEALTH CARE

Families with children eligible for school meals may be eligible for free health care coverage through Medicaid and/or Ohio's Healthy Start & Healthy Families programs. These programs include coverage for doctor visits, immunizations, physicals, prescriptions, dental, vision, mental health, substance abuse and more. Please call 1-800-324-8680 for more information or to request an application. Information can also be found on the web at http://jfs.ohio.gov/ohp/consumers/ familychild.stm. Anyone who has an Ohio Medicaid card is already receiving these services.

The information provided on the application is confidential and will only be used for the purpose to determine eligibility and may be verified at any time during the school year by school or other program official. To discourage the possibility of misrepresentation, the application forms contain a statement above the space for signature certifying that all information furnished is true and correct. Applications are being made in connection with the receipt of federal funds. Schools or other officials may check the information on the application at any time during the school year. Deliberate misrepresentation of information may subject the applicant to prosecution under applicable state and federal laws.

Households will be notified of the approval or denial of benefits.

Foster children are categorically eligible for free meal benefits regardless of the household's income. If a family has foster children living with them and wishes to apply for such meals or milk for them, contact the school for more information.

Under the provision of the policy, Judy Baumann, Food Service Director will review applications and determine eligibility. If a parent or guardian

disagrees with the decision on the application or the result of verification, the decision may be discussed with the determining official on an informal basis. If a formal appeal is desired, the household has the right to a fair hearing. A fair hearing can be requested either orally or in writing from:

The policy contains an outline of the hearing procedure.

Households may apply for benefits any time during the school year. If a household is not currently eligible and if the household size increases or income decreases because of unemployment or other reasons, the family should contact the school to file a new application. Such changes may make the children of the family eligible for free or reduced-price benefits if the family income falls at or below the levels shown above.

### **Nondiscrimination Statement**




