From the Superintendent

Levy Fails, What's Next?

On November 2 the voters of the Firelands School District turned down a request for additional funds to support operations by a margin of 50.7% to 49.3%, a total of 70 votes. The district is now facing a deficit of \$120,000 at the end of next school year and a \$2.6 million deficit by June 30, 2013.

Over the next few weeks the Board of Education will be challenged with identifying reductions in the operational budget of \$1.3 million dollars going into the next school year. The Board must also consider a possible May ballot issue to generate new revenue to stave off some of these cuts.

Throughout this process we will communicate with the Firelands residents. I anticipate a Community Forum in January will be held to discuss these issues with the public. We want to hear from you. Watch the website and local papers for a date.

State Funding

Over 50% of our revenue comes from the state. Because of a projected \$8 billion hole in the next state budget, substantial funding reductions to schools are anticipated. We have projected a close to 10% reduction of state funds in our financial forecast. In reality the reductions may be much higher. The state budget is not due to be finalized until summer. This is certainly a huge factor in the need for Firelands to secure new operating funds. Help is not coming from Columbus or the federal government. If we want to maintain the excellent school district that we have, we must do it on our own.

GUIDANCE CORNER

In early December, we will be focusing on career education with the Sophomore class to assist them in the major decisions they will have to make this year about their educational path. Students will explore college preparation, college options, college Tech Prep, and vocational training programs at the JVS. Listed below are the scheduled dates for information sessions about what is available at the LCJVS.

JVS Presentation to Sophomores – December 3, 2010

JVS Sophomore Tour – Thursday, January 27, 2011

JVS Open House – Sunday, February 6, 2011 – 1:30p.m. – 3:30p.m.

ALL SOPHOMORES will be taking the PLAN test on December 15, 2010. The plan will help identify college readiness and career goals.

ALL JUNIORS will be taking a PRE-ACT test on December 15, 2010 to increase college readiness.

2011-2012 scheduling for the Sophomores and Juniors will start the end of January.

We will be focusing on career exploration with the Freshmen in February, 2010. Upon completion of the career unit we will have them schedule for next year.

— JANUARY —

The First Semester will end on January 20, 2011.

Career Portfolio – Seniors will put together a 8-page Career portfolio. This portfolio will include transcripts, recommendations, and resumes. This will be done in Government Classes in January.

The list of scholarships are listed on the Firelands website. The process begins in January and runs until March 15th. The information put together in the Career Portfolios can be used to fill out the scholarships.

Parents, have you had discussions about college with your high school student? Students, have you talked with your parents about your plans for after high school? If so, have these conversations raised more questions than they have answered?

The process of selecting a college to attend after high school can be daunting, from scheduling visits to completing the applications and securing the necessary financial aid. This year, the Cleveland Scholarship Program has partnered with Firelands High School to make the process of going to college after high school easier.

My name is Kelly Korinko and I am a college access advisor with the Cleveland Scholarship Program and I work at Firelands High School every Friday throughout the entire school year. I am currently helping seniors finalize decisions on schools they should visit. Soon, I will be assisting Mr. Norheim and Mrs. Zimmer with the flood of college applications that we expect to see come through the guidance office doors.

There will be a lot of things to cover in the coming months, including applications, financial aid and scholarships. While we are making every effort to help seniors with their college plans, we also encourage juniors and sophomores to develop a college plan by going on college visits, taking postsecondary exams such as the PSAT (offered only during the fall of junior year) and the ACT or SAT prior to the beginning of senior year. Students and parents are welcome to make an appointment to meet with me to discuss any college related issue or stop in on Fridays. Currently, I am seeing students for one-on-one advising through the assistance of Mr. Norheim, but I am happy to field your questions, so do not hesitate to stop by or make an appointment by calling the guidance office.

Firelands High School Financial Aid Night will be held Tuesday, November 16th. Parents of juniors and seniors are welcome to attend.



Coach White also brought Marie Myers, who is the grandmother/mother of JJ Hick, son of the Cleveland Cavaliers. She spoke about how her life was full of tragedy, but she was able to turn that around and triumph from it.

This seminar has encouraged our Youth 4 Youth group to do many things to make the school's atmosphere better. The Youth 4 Youth showcase outside of Mr. Jones' room has a suggestion box for students to give ideas for Teen Talks, Dear Abby for the FHS Times school newspaper, and inspirational quotes for the showcase and for school announcements.

A white plate with a lemon slice and salt were placed on the table to symbolize the soldier’s bitter fate and their families’ tears. Several other items were placed on the “little white table”; however, the most moving items were the empty chair and the empty water glass that was turned over in memory of our POWs and MIAs. The black napkin brought tears to more than one participant as they realized that too many of our soldiers have made the ultimate sacrifice so that we can continue to experience freedom. Mrs. Neal and her students would like to say a public thank-you to Mr. Cline and Mr. Cruz for allowing us to set “a little white table” in your honor. You are our HERO!
